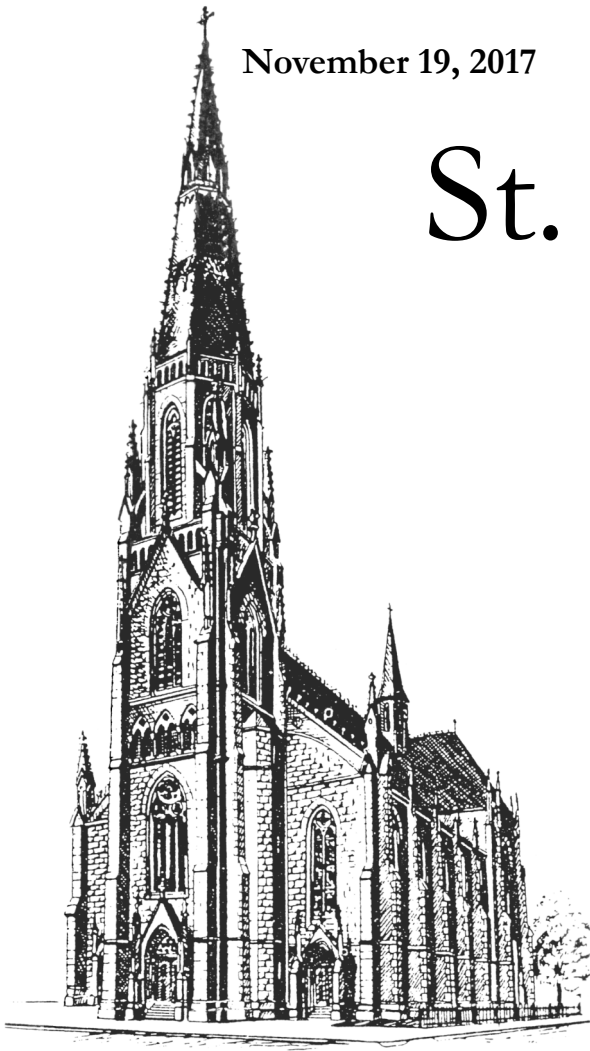

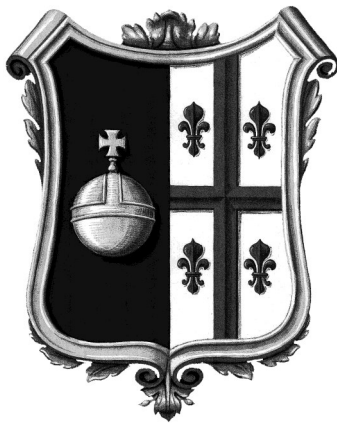

To Have Mass Offered

As we are blessed to have two priests at St. Joseph Oratory, there are twice as many daily Masses.

Why have Masses offered? St. Thomas Aquinas says: "*The celebration of Holy Mass is as valuable as the death of Jesus on the cross.*" St. John Marie Vianney said: "*There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us.*" St. Thomas also says that Masses are multiplied because of the soul's limited openness to Grace at that actual moment. As the souls in Purgatory cannot pray for themselves, St. Ambrose points out the importance of Masses to be offered for the deceased: "*We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord.*"
