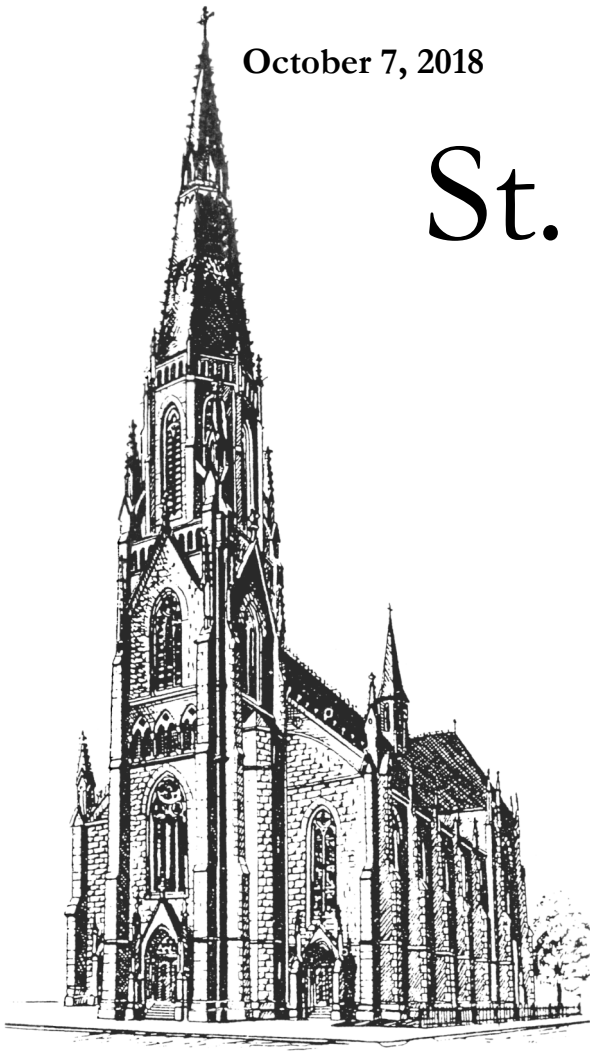

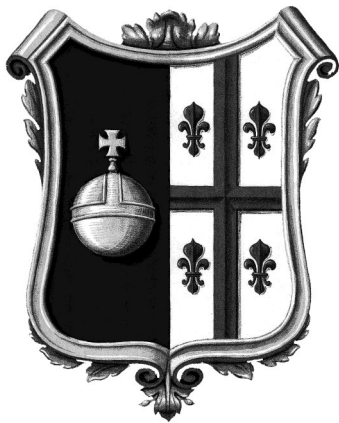

... that on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, we commemorate the extirpation of the Albigensian heresy, the victory of the Christian fleet at Lepanto in 1571, the victory of King Louis XIII over the Huguenots in 1628, the victory of Emperor Charles VI over the Turks in 1716, the lifting of the siege of Corfu in the same year, and the victory of Prince Eugene of Savoy in 1717.
