Did you know?

... that Albert the Great, or in Latin *Albertus Magnus*, was also known during his lifetime as *Doctor Universalis* and *Doctor Expertus*. He was the greatest German philosopher and theologian of the Middle Ages (the "dark ages"). Born in 1193, Saint Albert lived for 87 years during which he wrote on topics such as logic, theology, botany, geography, astronomy, astrology, mineralogy, alchemy, zoology, physiology, phrenology, justice, law, friendship, and love. He was the first to comment all of Aristotle's works, gleaned from the Latin translations and notes of the Arabian commentators. Even though he was known as a scientist, philosopher, astrologer, theologian, spiritual writer, ecumenist, and diplomat in his lifetime, he is best known as the teacher of Saint Thomas Aquinas. His feast is on November 15.
