DID YOU KNOW?

... that in 1898, Lewis Wattson, an Anglican minister, and Lurana White, a novice in an Anglican religious community started corresponding with each other on the question of practicing the evangelical counsel of poverty of the Franciscans in the Anglican Church. Both were of the Oxford Movement and, eventually, their discussion moved towards the goal of reunification of the Anglican and Catholic Churches under the Pope. They formed a Franciscan religious community under the tutelage of Our Lady of the Atonement in Garrison, New York. This Society of the Atonement under the Episcopal Church preached the primacy of the Roman pontiff and prayed for the corporate reunion of the two Churches. They found themselves increasingly ostracized by their fellow Anglicans and in 1909 they petitioned Pope Saint Pius X to enter into full communion with Rome. After their incorporation into the Catholic Church, they petitioned for an octave of prayer of Christian Unity from January 18 - 25, from the Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome to the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul.
