The Immaculate Heart of Mary

The attention of Christians was early on, attracted by the love and virtues of the Heart of Mary. It was, so to speak, at the foot of the Cross that the Christian heart first made the acquaintance of the Heart of Mary. Simeon's prophecy paved the way and furnished the devotion with one of its favorite formulae and most popular representations: the heart pierced with a sword.

Toward the end of the 11th century, we see slight indications of a regular devotion perceived in a sermon by St. Bernard. Later, St. Thomas Becket practiced a devotion to the joys and sorrows of Mary, initiated by Blessed Hermann (d.1245), one of the first spiritual children of St. Dominic; even later it appeared in St. Bridget's Book of Revelations.

St. Bernardine of Siena (d.1444) was absorbed in the contemplation of the virginal heart, and it is from him that the Church has borrowed the lessons of the Second Nocturn for the feast of the Heart of Mary. St. Francis de Sales speaks of the perfections of this heart, the model of love for God, and dedicated to it his *Theotimus*. But it was reserved to St. Jean Eudes (d. 1681) to propagate the devotion, along with that of the Sacred Heart, to make it public, and to have a feast celebrated in honor of the Heart of Mary.

With the revelation of the "miraculous medal" in 1830 and all the prodigies that followed, and then the establishment of the Archconfraternity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Refuge of Sinners, which spread rapidly throughout the world, the Congregation of Rites finally approved the Office and Mass of the Most Pure Heart of Mary without, however, imposing them upon the Universal Church. Pius XII instituted the feast for the whole Church, so as to obtain by her intercession "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue" (Decree of May 4, 1944).

At Fatima in 1917 the Blessed Virgin Mary made known the principal practices of the Five First Saturday devotion to the little children, which she requested in honor of her Immaculate Heart: *I promise to assist at the hour of death with all the graces necessary for salvation all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.*

Treatise on the Love of God

St. Francis DeSales

Book X. Of The Commandment Of Loving God Above All Things.

Ch 3. How, While The Whole Heart Is Employed In Sacred Love, Yet One May Love God In Various Ways, And Also Many Other Things Together With Him.

All true lovers are equal in this, that all give all their heart to God, and with all their strength, but they are unequal in this, that they give it diversely and in different manners, whence some give all their heart, with all their strength, less perfectly than others. This one gives it all by martyrdom, this, all by virginity, this, all by poverty, this, all by action, this, all by contemplation, this, all by the pastoral office; and whilst all give it all by the observance of the commandments, yet some give it with less perfection than others.

Yea, even Jacob who was called in Daniel the holy one of God, and whom God declares himself to have loved, protests that he had served Laban with all his strength, and why did he serve Laban, but to obtain Rachel, whom he loved with all his strength? He serves Laban with all his strength, he serves God with all his strength; he loves Rachel with all his strength, he loves God with all his strength: yet withal he loves not Rachel as God, nor God as Rachel; he loves God as his God, above all things and more than himself; he loves Rachel as his wife, above all other women, and as himself. He loves God with an absolutely and sovereignly supreme love; and Rachel with a supreme nuptial love. Nor is the one love contrary to the other, since that of Rachel does not violate the privileges and sovereign prerogatives of the love of God.

So that our love to God, Theotimus, takes its worth from the eminence and excellence of the motive for which, and according to which, we love him; in that we love him for his sovereign infinite goodness, as God, and because he is God.

Now one drop of this love is worth more, has more power, and deserves more esteem, than all the other loves that can ever enter into the hearts of men or amongst the choirs of angels. For while this love lives, it reigns and bears the sceptre over all the affections, making God to be preferred in its will before all things, indifferently, universally, and without reserve.
