The Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin

Pius VII, by his Decree of September 18, 1814, extended to the whole Church the Feast of Our Lady of Seven Sorrows, which had been granted to the Servite Order in 1688. On this feast day, September 15, the sorrows of the Blessed Virgin are presented to us as the sole object of our contemplation. We are at liberty to consider all the trials of her life of spiritual martyrdom, which are the source of so much joy and so many blessings to ourselves. All the sufferings of Mary come from her desire to share in the sufferings of Jesus.

The *Church*, in commemorating Mary's sufferings *emphasizes her great and courageous love which caused her to be so closely associated with the work of our Redemption*. Like Judith, the Virgin Mother, faced with the distress and tribulation of her people, spared herself nothing to save us from ruin. By offering her Son for us, she became our Mother and we became her children. That is why the Epistle for the day is from the Book of Judith, but is to be applied to Mary.

The short Gospel for the Mass of the Seven Sorrows shows Jesus entrusting His Mother to St. John, and therefore to all of us, signifying the beginning of her maternal mission in our regard.

The Seven Sorrows of Our Lady are: The *Prophecy of Simeon*, the *Flight into Egypt*, the *Loss of the Child Jesus in Jerusalem*, the *Meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross*, the *Crucifixion*, the *Taking Down of the Body of Jesus from the Cross* and *Jesus being laid in the Tomb*.

There are *many different devotions*, prayers, litanies, novenas, consecrations, Via Matris (Way of Mary) and rosary chaplets that honor the Seven Sorrows. Devotion to the Sorrows of Mary is recommended by St. Bridget of Sweden, St. Alphonsus Liguori, and St. Gabriel Possenti, for souls who wish to rid themselves of sinful habits and for those desiring sanctity. Those who sincerely employ her aid through meditation on her sorrows can expect great consolations, confidence in God's mercy, the special protection of the Blessed Mother at the hour of temptation and at death.

Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

September 15

The Blessed Virgin Mary revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that seven graces are granted to the souls who honor her daily by saying seven Hail Mary's and meditating on her tears and dolors.

- 1) I will grant peace to their families.
- 2) They will be enlightened about the divine mysteries.
- 3) I will console them in their pains and I will accompany them in their work.
- 4) I will give them as much as they ask for as long as it does not oppose the adorable will of my divine Son or the sanctification of their souls.
- 5) I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives.
- 6) I will visibly help them at the moment of their death, they will see the face of their Mother.
- 7) I have obtained (this Grace) from my divine Son, that those who propagate this devotion to my tears and dolors, will be taken directly from this earthly life to eternal happiness since all their sins will be forgiven and my Son and I will be their eternal consolation and joy.

St. Alphonsus Liguori testifies to complementary revelations given by Our Lord to St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207-1231) where Jesus further promises four special graces to those dedicated to the sufferings of the co-redeeming Mother:

1. That those who before death invoke the Blessed Mother in the name of her sorrows, should obtain true repentance of all their sins.
2. That He would protect in their tribulations all who remember this devotion, and that He would protect them especially at the hour of death.
3. That He would impress upon their minds the remembrance of His Passion, and that they should have their reward for it in Heaven.
4. That He would commit such devout clients to the hands of Mary, so that she might obtain for these souls all the graces she wanted to lavish upon them.

Consecration to Our Lady of Sorrows

Most holy Virgin and Queen of Martyrs, Mary, would that I could be in Heaven, there to contemplate the honors rendered to thee by the Most Holy Trinity and by the whole Heavenly Court! But since I am still a pilgrim in this vale of tears, receive from me, thy unworthy servant and a poor sinner, the most sincere homage and the most perfect act of vassalage a human creature can offer thee. In thy Immaculate Heart, pierced with so many swords of sorrow, I place today my poor soul forever; receive me as a partaker in thy dolors, and never suffer that I should depart from that Cross on which thy only begotten Son expired for me. With thee, O Mary, I will endure all the sufferings, contradictions, infirmities, with which it will please thy Divine Son to visit me in this life. All of them I offer to thee, in memory of the Dolors which thou didst suffer during thy life, that every thought of my mind, every beating of my heart may henceforward be an act of compassion to thy Sorrows, and of complacency for the glory thou now enjoyest in Heaven. Since then, O Dear Mother, I now compassionate thy Dolors, and rejoice in seeing thee glorified, do thou also have compassion on me, and reconcile me to thy Son Jesus, that I may become thy true and loyal son (daughter); come on my last day and assist me in my last agony, even as thou wert present at the Agony of thy Divine Son Jesus, that from this painful exile I may go to Heaven, there to be made partaker of thy glory. Amen.
