St. John Cantius

Feast Day October 20

St. John Cantius was a canon and professor of theology at Krakow, Poland, later a parish priest of Olkusz, Bohemia, and then a professor once again. He was born in the diocese of Kenty in 1403. He studied with great ability, success, and industry, leading a life of great humility and wonderful charity. He received his doctorate in philosophy in 1418. He conducted formation classes for the young novices of the Canons Regular of the Most Holy Sepulcher where he became firmly grounded in the writings and spirituality of St. Augustine. While teaching, he was ousted by rivals with a false accusation and then took up the position at Olkusz.

His motto was: *Conturbare cave: non est placare suave, Infamare cave; nam revocare grave: Guard against causing trouble and slandering others, for it is difficult to right the evil done.*

The good saint did, however, shrink from the duties and burdens of being a parish priest and returned to his life as a professor at Krakow. There while teaching Scripture, he also helped, in the field of physics, to develop the theory of “impetus,” which anticipated the work of Galileo and Newton. And although in a paid position, he subsisted on only what was strictly necessary to sustain his life, and gave the rest of his salary to the poor, along with his clothes and shoes. Once he returned home with bare feet, letting his cloak fall to the ground in an effort to hide them.

Having a great love for the Holy See, John made four pilgrimages to Rome, on foot, carrying his necessities on his back the whole way. Having an equal love for the Passion of Christ he made one journey to Jerusalem where he sought martyrdom by preaching to the Turks.

St. John Cantius died on Christmas Eve, 1473, and was canonized by Pope Clement XIII in 1767. He is invoked as one of the patrons of Poland, and in cases of ulcers, fever, and consumption, and on behalf of priests, students, pilgrims and teachers. He also leaves behind 26 volumes totaling 18,000 pages of hand-copied manuscripts of Holy Scripture, theological tracts and other scholarly works, along with his name above the doors of many, many churches throughout Poland, eastern Europe in general, and America. His tomb is in the University of Krakow’s Collegiate Church of St. Anne where it continues to draw pilgrims to this day.

As a matter of fact, several years ago the Holy See privileged the Institute's members and its faithful with a **plenary indulgence for the main patronal feasts**, which are: the **Feast of Christ the King** (last Sunday in October) and the feasts of the **Immaculate Conception** (Dec. 8), **St. Francis de Sales** (Jan. 29), **St. Thomas Aquinas** (Mar. 7) and **St. Benedict** (Mar. 21).

N.B. The Church grants a Plenary Indulgence for the public recitation of the *Act of Reparation of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus* (to be published in the next bulletin) on this feast day.
