Big cities of the modern world are large deserts too. After walking and battling during forty days in the sand of the desert, we will be ready to meet the sun of Jesus rising on Easter Sunday.

# MEDITATIONS ON ST. JOSEPH FOR MARCH

In a Lenten message to American school children, Pope Pius XII wrote of St. Joseph:

*Day after day, at home and in the carpenter's shop, his eyes rested on Jesus; he protected Him against the dangers of childhood; he guided His advancing years, and by hard work and with religious devotedness he provided for the increasing needs of the Mother and the Son.... Don't you think that now in heaven he is the same loving father and guardian of the whole Church, of all its members, as he was of its Head on earth?*

While mostly cloaked in obscurity throughout his life, the Fathers of the Church, saints, and popes still gleaned from Scripture and tradition evidence of St. Joseph's exalted position. While God gives all necessary dispositions to those whom He fingers for special missions -- Mary being a prime example -- He also enlightens them sufficiently in order to understand and carry out the mission, and thus it is with the chaste and holy St. Joseph.

St. Joseph saw, held, conversed with, and affectionately embraced "Him whom the faithful were to receive in the bread that came down from heaven whereby they might obtain eternal life," Pope Pius IX tells us. No one else but Joseph lived with Mary and her Child. No one else but Joseph exercised the rights of actual fatherhood over Jesus. And no one else provided for them. He governed the household, cherishing Jesus and Mary, sacrificing for them, protecting and defending their sacred persons -- from the crib in Bethlehem, to Egypt and back, and in the humble abode of Nazareth.

It therefore stands to reason that St. Joseph will continue to do for the Church what he did for his family. He will provide for us, preserving the Eucharist for our souls' nourishment if we but ask. As Christ made him "Lord of His house and ruler of all His possessions," he will do the same for us. He will cherish and protect us -- the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church.

Joseph, the just man, a man for all seasons and times can be our patron and intercessor in heaven, especially for workers and family providers. He can be our model in virtue and our guide through this vale of tears. We should invoke his help for the custodians of the Holy Eucharist, the *alter Christi* in our lives -- our priests. Just as Our Savior's mother holds much sway in Heaven, so too does the privileged and obedient Joseph, so go to Joseph!

## Lessons From The Temptation of Christ

Christ, the Son of God was not satisfied with atoning for all our sins by dying on the cross; He digned to suffer a fast of forty days and forty nights, in order to encourage us to do penance. What are all our penances, even were they done thoroughly, when we compare them with the severity of this fast of Jesus in the desert? Instead of complaining about a slight inconvenience of a few days' duration, we should compassionate our innocent Jesus who subjected Himself to a most rigorous privation for our sakes.

Prayer, devotedness to us, and the knowledge of the exactness of His Father's justice supported Him. When the forty days were over, and His human nature faint from exhaustion, He was then assailed by temptation; but here again, He thinks of us and sets the example: triumphing over temptation, calmly and resolutely.

When the Christian soul is exposed to vile insults from satan, it complains to God for permitting such humiliations. On these occasions, the Christian soul must think of Jesus, the Saint of saints, who was given over to the wicked spirit. Souls under the violence of temptation must resist with all their energies; they are not less in the eyes of God for having undergone the attack -- and satan, now rejected, retires with one more eternal shame and chastisement upon him.

We are all sinners; the occupations of everyday life take up our thoughts, and the weakness of the flesh induces us to relax our usual austerities. So it is that our Lord has providentially given us these forty days to regain our purity of soul. The good works and holy fastings of this season were instituted as an atonement for the sins we commit during the rest of the year. But our fast does not consist in the mere abstinence from food; it is not much use to deny food to our body unless we restrain the soul from sin.

We must consider the triple temptations to fight against: the concupiscence of the flesh -- the love of sensual things; concupiscence of the eyes -- the love of the goods of this world; and the pride of life -- that confidence in ourselves that leads us to vanity and presumption, making us forget that our life and every good gift, comes from God. Every one of our sins comes from one of these sources, and it is Our Savior who should be our model in conquering these temptations -- through forbearance and perseverance.
