Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin

Friday, September 8 - 6:00p.m. Mass

September 8, the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin, is one of only three birthdays honored in the liturgical year (the others being that of St. John the Baptist and that of Jesus Christ Himself). We know little about Mary's birth and youth, but we recall that Mary's nativity is the birth of the woman destined by God from the beginning of time to be born of the House of David and the Tribe of Judah; the woman whose enmity toward Satan was spoken of as far back as Genesis; the woman who St. John saw crowned with stars and with the moon at her feet; the woman who God chose to bear His Son and bring life to the world.

With the birth of the Blessed Virgin we see the crossing of the line between the Old Testament and the New, Mary the Dawn, meaning dawn of redemption, came forth from the heart of the eternal Word. By the cooperation of the Holy Spirit, she was pleased to form that Body and Soul who was to become our Savior. This is the sublime meaning of her birthday; Mary, the new Eve, is the life and the Mother of all the living, replacing Eve, the mother of sin and death.

The Church rejoices on this feast day and asks God for an increase in the graces for peace to be bestowed on man through the mystery of the Incarnation. St. Augustine says the earth too rejoiced and shone forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed"; the *Collect* of the Mass of the Nativity specifically speaks of these things.

Dom Guerang er urges us to accept the invitation to celebrate this birthday: "Let us ask the fruit of this sweet Feast, for that peace which seems to flee ever farther and farther from our unhappy times. *Queen of Angels, Thou art our Queen also; accept us as Thy servants. On this day, when the first movement of Thy holy soul was towards God, and the first smile of Thy lovely eyes was for Thy happy parents, may holy Anne allow us to kneel and kiss Thy little hand, already filled with the divine bounties of which Thou art the predestined dispenser. And now, grow up, sweet little one! Let Thy feet be strengthened to crush the serpent, and Thy arms to carry the treasure of the world! Angels and men, the whole of nature, God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, all are awaiting the solemn moment, when Gabriel may fly down from Heaven to hail Thee full of grace, and bring Thee the message of eternal love.*"
