May Christ dwell in our hearts by faith.



Sunday, September 24, 2017 - Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost



Feast of the Dedication St. Michael the Archangel September 29 - 6:00pm Mass

St. Michael's name - *Quis ut Deus?* or **Who is Like God?**
This was the war-cry of the good angels in the battle fought in heaven against the enemy and his followers.

Four times his name is recorded in Scripture:

Daniel 10:13, Gabriel says to Daniel, when he asks God to permit the Jews to return to Jerusalem: "The Angel of the kingdom of the Persians resisted me...and, behold Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me...and none is my helper in all these things, but Michael your prince."

Daniel 12, the Angel speaking of the end of the world and the Antichrist says: "At that time shall Michael rise up, the great prince, who standeth for the children of thy people."

Catholic Epistle of St. Jude: "When Michael the Archangel, disputing with the devil, contended about the body of Moses," etc. St. Jude alludes to an ancient Jewish tradition of a dispute between Michael and Satan over the body of Moses. St. Michael concealed the tomb of Moses; Satan, however, by disclosing it, tried to seduce the Jewish people to the sin of hero-worship. St. Michael also guards the body of Eve, according to the "Revelation of Moses" another Apocryphal Gospel.

Apocalypse 12:7, "And there was a great battle in heaven, Michael and his angels fought with the dragon." St. John speaks here of the great conflict at the end of time.

Following these Scriptural passages then, Christian tradition assigns to St. Michael four functions:

- * To fight against Satan.
- * To rescue the souls of the faithful from the power of the enemy, especially at the hour of death.
- * To be the champion of God's people, the Jews in the Old Law, the Christians in the New Testament; therefore, he was the patron of the Church, and of the orders of knights during the Middle Ages.
- * To call away from earth and bring men's souls to judgment.

It would have been natural to St. Michael, the champion of the Jewish people, to be the champion also of Christians, giving victory in war to his clients. Tradition relates that St. Michael in the earliest ages caused a medicinal spring to spout at Chairtopa near Colossae, where all the sick who bathed there, invoking the Blessed Trinity and St. Michael, were cured.

Still more famous are the springs which St. Michael is said to have drawn from the rock at Colossae. The pagans directed a stream against the sanctuary of St. Michael to destroy it, but the archangel split the rock by lightning to give a new bed to the stream, and sanctified forever the waters which came from the gorge. The Greeks claim that this apparition took place about the middle of the 1st century and celebrate a feast in commemoration of it on Sept. 6. At Constantinople, the archangel is said to have appeared to the Emperor Constantine. The Christians of Egypt placed their life-giving river, the Nile, under the protection of St. Michael; on June 12, when the river commences to rise, they keep as a holiday of obligation for the feast of St. Michael "for the rising of the Nile." According to a legend of the 10th century he appeared in Rome over the Moles Hadriani (Castel di S. Angelo), in 950, during the procession which St. Gregory held against the pestilence, putting an end to the plague. Boniface IV (608-15) built on the Moles Hadriani in honor of him, a great church.

Well known is the apparition of St. Michael on May 8 at his renowned sanctuary on Monte Gargano in either the late 5th or early 6th century, where his original glory as patron in war was restored to him. To his intercession the Lombards attributed their victory over the Greek Neapolitans, on May 8, 663. In commemoration of this victory the Church instituted a special feast in honor of the archangel on May 8 which has spread over the entire Latin Church and is now called the "Apparitio S. Michaelis."

In Normandy St. Michael is the patron of mariners in his famous sanctuary at Mont-Saint-Michel in the Diocese of Coutances. He is said to have appeared there, in 708, to St. Aubert, Bishop of Avranches. In Normandy, his feast was universally celebrated on Oct. 18, the anniversary of the dedication of the first church, in 710. In Germany, after its evangelization, St. Michael replaced the pagan god Wotan for Christians, to whom many mountains were sacred, hence the numerous mountain chapels that now honor St. Michael all over Germany.

St. Wenceslaus - September 28

St. Wenceslaus, also known by Vaclav, was born near Prague, and was the son of Duke Wratislav. He was taught Christianity by his grandmother, St. Ludmila. The Magyars, along with Drahomira, an anti-Christian faction murdered the Duke and St. Ludmila, and took over the government. Wenceslaus was declared the new ruler after a coup in 922. He encouraged Christianity. Boleslaus, his brother, no longer successor to the throne, after Wenceslaus' son was born, joined a group of noble Czech dissenters. They invited Wenceslaus to a religious festival, trapped and killed him on the doorstep of a church while on the way to Mass. Virtually from the moment of his death, Wenceslaus was considered a martyr and venerated as a saint. Miracles were reported at his tomb, and his remains were translated to the church of St. Vitus in Prague which became a major pilgrimage site. He is the patron saint of Bohemia and his feast day is Sept. 28.

Veneration of the Relic of the Veil of the Blessed Virgin Mary ~During~ St. Patrick's Oratory Pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help

The white veil of the Blessed Virgin Mary; this most precious relic's history.

In the year 1895, Mystic and Doctor of the Church, Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, "The Little Flower," wrote in her last poem, "Beneath thy Veil thy Jesus slept." In 1948, mystic Maria Valtorta revealed in her detailed work about the life of Christ that "Our Lady placed her veil on newborn Jesus, in the holy manger!" In 1820, mystic, visionary, and stigmatist Blessed Ann Catherine Emmerich revealed that "Mary placed her veil on Jesus to cover His nakedness when taken down from the Cross."

After the crucifixion, the cross, the three nails, the title, the crown of thorns, and this most precious relic of The Blessed Virgin Mary's Veil - WITH THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS ON IT FROM THE CRUCIFIXION, were hidden in a covered cave in Jerusalem. In the year 326 A.D. Saint Helena found them, and gave them to her son Emperor Constantine. Mary's Veil, which is off-white in color, was handed down to members of the royal families for the next 550 years. It was eventually given to Charlemagne's grandson Emperor Charles le Chauve in France who gave Mary's Veil to the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Chartres, France, in the year 876 A.D.

The Cathedral of Notre Dame was enlarged specifically to keep this magnificent, very sacred relic of Our Lady's Veil. Many miracles occurred in the special Chapel in Notre Dame and throughout France through Mary's Veil. It was venerated there for the next 917 years.

In the year 1793, during the desecration of religious objects during the terrible French Revolution's "reign of terror," Mary's Veil was purposely cut in half and hidden for safety. After the ten year-long French Revolution ended, the pieces of Mary's Veil were returned to Notre Dame Cathedral. A very small part of Mary's Veil was divided into small relics for several parishes in the world.
