"Lord at thy Word, I will let down the net."

No doubt the fishermen brought their nets and boats to land in sheer vexation. They had labored all night and had taken nothing.

The world is like a great sea wherein we are incapable of doing the least good by ourselves "for it is God who works in us both to will and to accomplish, according to His Good Will".

Jesus knows how to make use of His followers as instruments for His mission of salvation.

The Gospel of today gives us a wonderful lesson: every durable success first comes from the special grace and assistance of God and we are nothing of ourselves. We see that no man, no matter how great he is before the world, can have the least reason for self-satisfaction. Rather, in everything he is to be humble, lowly and meek before God and men. In a word, he who thinks himself to be something deceives himself.

The unfruitful work of the fishermen in the darkness of the night is a practical demonstration of the words of Jesus: "Without me you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5)

In our daily existence, we are able to recognize that this is often our situation too. How many efforts we have made to rid ourselves of this or that attachment, to forget injuries, to adapt ourselves to our neighbor's way of doing things, to subject our will to another's. And yet, after all these attempts, we find our hands empty, like St. Peter's nets.

Let us not be discouraged; if we can humbly acknowledge our failures instead of feeling annoyance because of them. Each failure itself will turn into victory. We must have great faith in Jesus, never allowing ourselves to give up through lack of success. Then let us repeat with Peter a similar cry of confidence: "Lord at thy Word, I will let down the net." And let us repeat it every day, every moment, without ever growing weary.

ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA

Thursday, June 21 - 8:00 a.m. Mass

St. Aloysius Gonzaga (1568–1591) was born to a noble Italian family, the eldest of seven children, and was destined for the military. However, by the time he was 9 years of age he chose the religious life and made a personal vow of chastity. As a safeguard against sexual temptation he always kept his eyes downcast in the presence of women. Although many tried to dissuade him from his chosen vocation, he was eventually allowed to renounce his inheritance and enter the seminary in order to become a Jesuit priest. While he was studying in Rome, there was an outbreak of the plague. Aloysius volunteered to care for the sick, despite the delicateness of his own health. As a result, he contracted the disease and died at the age of 23, before completing his priestly studies. St. Aloysius was connected with two great figures of the Counter-Reformation: he received his First Holy Communion at the age of 12 from St. Charles Borromeo, and his Last Rites from St. Robert Bellarmine, both of whom served as his spiritual advisers. On the night of his death, St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi had a vision of him being received into great glory. St. Aloysius Gonzaga is the patron saint of youth and bodily purity. His feast day is June 21st.
