WE ARE WASHED IN THAT BLOOD

In the Gospel, the definite moment of Redemption for humanity is not when Jesus preaches or heals the sick. It is only when the divine Love is nailed to the cross and bleeding.

Remember, every action of God is governed by love, because God is love itself. It is His nature to love; this is why Christianity is the religion of radical love.

When we join our sufferings to Christ's infinite merits, we participate in God's plan of salvation and obtain the conversion of souls. As our Lady said at Fatima: "Many souls go to hell because there is no one to sacrifice themselves and pray for them." This is not a morbid and sad way, it is offering up daily small sacrifices with joy and accepting with resignation the divine will in all things.

We do not have to seek suffering or ordeals but we can receive them as a purification of all that is not love in us and a participation in the Redemption operated by Jesus who obtains the conversions of souls.

This quality of redemption of suffering, of patience, is the highest because it is directed toward the salvation of souls. It's an act of imitation of Jesus, suffering like Jesus in order to obtain heaven for us and others. This redemptive suffering is not necessarily extreme. The smaller act of pure love, of patience, is powerful and can save countless souls.

MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

JULY

The month of July traditionally honors the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. It is the blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, which cleanses from sin, therefore the Church developed a devotion to Jesus' physical blood and its mystical power, just as it did for His Sacred Heart from which His blood poured out on the Cross. The Precious Blood of Jesus courses through the Church spiritually, giving eternal life to the Body of Christ through the sacraments. Many saints had a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus, most notably St. Catherine of Siena. Devotion to the Precious Blood spread greatly through the preaching of Bl. Gaspar del Bufalo, a 19th century priest and founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, and was later approved and recommended by the Holy See. The feast day of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus is July 1st.

DRESS FOR MASS - SUMMER TIME & ALWAYS

The warm weather has returned and it may seem even more difficult to dress appropriately for Mass, but it is always important. Clothing covers the body because as God's temple it is sacred, and it is part of the mystery of life, which is sacred. Different types of clothing are worn for various activities or occasions. For Mass we always should dress modestly and in our "Sunday best".

The CCC states: "...Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest." We are the guests in His house, He is our guest when we receive him properly and worthily in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

- Modest dress expresses the respect we have for ourselves, and the respect we expect from others.
- Modest dress also takes into account wounded human nature. Improper dress can tempt others to sin.

We dress with extra care when visiting a church and especially when attending Mass. The Sunday best expresses how clearly holy the Sacred Mysteries are. We show particular respect for the sacredness of the place and for our neighbor who comes to be spiritually strengthened and renewed and not to be distracted, upset or even tempted to sin.

During Holy Mass our Oratory becomes Calvary. Here, Heaven and earth meet up and embrace each other. The most sacred mysteries of the Incarnation and Redemption are being renewed and its infinite fruits are applied to each one of us.

How truly blessed we are! Here the God-Man Jesus Christ is truly present. This sacred building is HIS HOUSE. He is the Divine Host and we are HIS truly blessed guests. When He pours forth not only His sacred doctrine and prayers, but His Most Precious Blood, legions of angels adore Him prostrate in awe and reverence. And so do we!
