A Tremendous Mystery

This morning we are able to say with Saint Paul: "We have an altar," (Heb. 13:10). The main altar of St. Patrick's is now restored to its original location and beauty.

We have an altar because of your generous support, dear faithful. We have an altar because the Mass is a sacrifice.

The altar represents the Table of the Lord at which Jesus sat when He instituted the Sacrifice of the Mass on the night before His bitter Passion and Death. It also signifies the Cross on which Christ offered the bloody sacrifice, of which the Mass is the unbloody renewal. Above all, the altar denotes Christ, in Whom and through Whom every oblation and act of worship is offered to God. As the altar is the support of the sacrifice, so Christ is the support and strength of every sacrifice and act of worship, for nothing can be offered acceptably to God except by and through Christ.

What is going on at the altar? It is something so different from everything we meet within our daily life. The Mass is a tremendous mystery, so profoundly attractive. The Incarnation of Christ is the divine event to which the whole creation moves and the mystery celebrated on the altar may well seem its restful shadow--the vestments, the burning candles, the tinkle of the bell, the singing, the language, the ceremonies, the whispered prayers--the awe and reverence of the congregation tell us that the Kingdom of God is among us.

May this sublime reality drive us with greater fervor.

THE BROWN SCAPULAR

DON'T MISS THIS POWERFUL SACRAMENTAL!

You may receive the Brown Scapular, the Mantle of Our Lady on Monday, July 16.

All those who Wish to be enrolled, please be in the front pews immediately following the 8:00am Mass

WEAR YOUR BROWN SCAPULAR!

“Take, beloved son this scapular as a badge of my confraternity and a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, and a pledge of peace and of the covenant.” *(The Mother of God to St. Simon Stock)*

“As a tender mother, I will descend into Purgatory on the Saturday after their death and will deliver them and bring them to the holy mountain, into the happy sojourn of life everlasting.” *(Words of the Blessed Mother to Pope John XXII)*

The Conditions, expressing the special trust you place into the Blessed Virgin Mary, are:

1. Be enrolled or vested with the Brown Scapular by any Roman Catholic Priest.
 2. Wear the Scapular in good faith.
 3. Be chaste. (according to your state in life)
 4. Recite daily the Little Hours of the Blessed Virgin or *(in addition to the commanded days)*, abstain from meat on all Wednesdays and Saturdays of the year. *(except when Christmas falls on one of these days)*
- N.B. The Priest commonly commutes the fourth condition into another pious work (e. g. Recite 3 Hail Mary's in Honor of Mary's Immaculate Conception).

After your enrollment you become a member of the spiritual family of Carmel (Confraternity of the Brown Scapular) and therefore share into the prayers and spiritual treasures of the order. A common Question; After being enrolled, do subsequent Scapulars need to be blessed? No...subsequent Scapulars need not be blessed as the blessing and imposition are attached to the wearer for life.

Prayer to Our Lady of Mount Carmel

“Thou who, with special mercy, look upon those clothed in thy beloved Habit, cast a glance of pity upon me.

Fortify my weakness with thy strength; enlighten the darkness of my mind with thy wisdom;

Increase my faith, hope and charity. Assist me during life, console me by thy presence at my death, and present me to the August trinity as thy devoted child, that I may bless thee for all eternity in Paradise. Amen.”



St. Alexis, Confessor

Tuesday, July 17, 6:00pm Mass

Alexis was the only son of the Roman Senator, Euphemianos. He received an excellent education and was taught by his parents that the best use of treasures is to share them with the poorest of people. He wore a hair shirt under his robes and spent many hours in prayer.

His parents arranged a marriage for him, but he refused because he had already secretly dedicated himself wholly to God. His parents insisted and so he submitted to their request that he marry. On the night of the wedding feast he approached his bride, handed her his expensive ring and belt with these words that said: "May God be between us until His grace gives us something better." She did not understand. Dressed as a beggar, he escaped and went by sea to Edessa, living as a beggar and praying in front of the sanctuary of Our Lady of Edessa for 17 years.

Because of his life of prayer, sacrifice, and charity, he became quite popular, and fearing the temptation of earthly glory, he once again set out on the sea, returning to his home city. He was so changed in appearance that he easily begged a spot in a corner of his father's house, under the stairs, with no one recognizing him. He endured the grieving cries of his mother and his bride which he could hear, and ill treatment from the servants, but he offered all up to God for 17 more years.

He was inspired by God to write the story of his life, which he understood to mean that he would soon die. On the next Sunday at Mass, Pope Innocent I, still an Archbishop at the time, heard a voice coming from the sanctuary, saying, "Look for the man of God, he would pray for Rome and God would hear him. He will die on Friday."

For five days the entire city looked for a holy man. On Friday at Mass the same voice was heard by the assembly, "The holy man is in Senator Euphemianos' house. Everyone rushed to the Senator's house and found Alexis dead; his face shone so brightly that it was impossible to look at it. Euphemianos found a paper in the Saint's hand. In it, his son revealed his true identity and explained what he could, begging forgiveness and confessing his great but unearthly love for his parents and spouse.

Many miracles were attributed to him before he was buried; sight was restored to the blind and hearing to the deaf; others were freed from demonic torment. At the burial a heavenly fragrance of myrrh gushed from the grave, healing all who were anointed with it.

Saint, Alexis was truly a holy man who forsook all, even his beloved family and bride for the sake of the love of God.
