

Reign over us and teach us how to make the Heart of Jesus reign and triumph in us and around us as It has reigned and triumphed in thee.

Reign over us, dearest Mother, that we may be thine in prosperity and in adversity, in joy and in sorrow, in health and in sickness, in life and in death. O most compassionate Heart of Mary, Queen of Virgins, watch over our minds and hearts and preserve them from the deluge of impurity which thou didst lament so sorrowfully at Fatima. We want to be pure like thee. We want to atone for the many sins committed against Jesus and thee. We want to call down upon our country and the whole world the peace of God in justice and charity.

Therefore, we promise now to imitate thy virtues by the practice of a Christian life without regard to human respect. We resolve to receive Holy Communion on the first Saturday of every month and to offer thee five decades of the Rosary each day together with our sacrifices of reparation and penance. Amen.

Immaculate heart of Mary, Obtain for us pardon of our manifold sins and offenses.
Immaculate heart of Mary, Bring all men to the feet of thy Divine Child.
Immaculate heart of Mary, Obtain peace for the world.

O God of infinite goodness and mercy, fill our hearts with a great confidence in Thy most holy Mother, whom we invoke under the title of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and grant us by her most powerful intercession all the graces, spiritual and temporal, which we need. Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

August 22 - 8:00 a.m. Mass

The attention of Christians was early on attracted by the love and virtues of the Heart of Mary. It was, so to speak, at the foot of the Cross that the Christian heart first made the acquaintance of the Heart of Mary. Simeon's prophecy paved the way, and furnished the devotion with one of its favorite formulae and most popular representations — the heart pierced with a sword.

Toward the end of the 11th century, we see slight indications of a regular devotion in a sermon by St. Bernard. Later, St. Thomas Becket practiced a devotion to the joys and sorrows of Mary, initiated by Blessed Hermann (d.1245), one of the first spiritual children of St. Dominic; even later it appeared in St. Bridget's Book of Revelations.

St. Bernardine of Siena (d.1444) was absorbed in the contemplation of the virginal heart, and it is from him that the Church has borrowed the lessons of the Second Nocturn for the feast of the Heart of Mary. St. Francis de Sales speaks of the perfections of this heart, the model of love for God, and dedicated to it his *Theotimus*. But it was reserved to St. John Eudes (d. 1681) to propagate the devotion, along with that of the Sacred Heart, to make it public, and to have a feast celebrated in honor of the Heart of Mary.

With the revelation of the "Miraculous Medal" in 1830 and all the prodigies that followed, and then the establishment of the Archconfraternity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Refuge of Sinners, which spread rapidly throughout the world, the Congregation of Rites finally approved the Office and Mass of the Most Pure Heart of Mary without, however, imposing them upon the Universal Church. Pius XII instituted the feast for the whole Church, so as to obtain by her intercession "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue" (Decree of May 4, 1944).

At Fatima in 1917 the Blessed Virgin Mary made known the principal practices of the Five First Saturday devotion to the little children, which she requested in honor of her Immaculate Heart: "*I promise to assist at the hour of death with all the graces necessary for salvation all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.*"

ROBINSONVILLE — In 2009 after a year-long celebration marking the 150th anniversary of the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, The Most Reverend David L. Ricken, DD, JCL rededicated the Diocese of Green Bay to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. By rededicating the diocese to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, said Bishop Ricken, "we simply thank the Lord and the Blessed Mother for all the graces they have poured out upon us, upon this diocese, and upon every pilgrim who has come here to pray and be nourished. The Blessed Mother will be special to this place, hopefully forever, and she is definitely a sign of hope to our world."
