Have we made a point of spending time with our Lord?

Certainly, if we spend no more than an hour a week praying distractedly at Sunday Mass, after a hurried trip in the car with the radio blasting, we can't really expect to grow in the love of God.

Have we made a point of approaching Him through the Sacraments? We know that Faith and Charity are virtues that are nourished by frequent confession and Communion; that they must come from God and can't be otherwise acquired. Certainly we can't expect to love God if we reject the means of love that He has provided us with.

Have we made a point of approaching all things in our life with humility? It is not by accident that the Church has us read this particular Epistle and Gospel together. "He who exalts himself shall be humbled." Certainly, we will never come to the love of God if we go around with the attitude that we are better than those around us. By showing contempt for His creatures we can only develop contempt for the Creator.

In summary, let me say simply that if we are to have a spiritual life that is of any value, we must strive to take the God-given gifts of Faith and Charity and strive to develop them within ourselves. We must know God and love God. Both of these take time and we must be prepared to spend it. Study, prayer, and the frequent reception of the Sacraments must be our practice. And everything we do must be done in the spirit of humility. For "he who humbles himself will be exalted—will be strengthened by the Spirit in the inner man—and will have Christ dwell in his heart," both in Faith and in Charity; the knowledge and the love of God.

The Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Saturday, September 15 - 9:00 a.m. Mass

September is dedicated to the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The devotion has its origins in the association of Mary with the Passion of her Son. In fact, the Son and Mother were united in a single will to save us. The Church commemorates these sufferings with two feast days, one on September 15, emphasizing Mary's great and courageous love which caused her to be so closely associated with the work of Redemption.

Dom Guéranger says about Mary's dolors:

"Mary's great sorrows began at the prediction of Simeon that a sword would transpierce Her heart. Soon afterwards, She was obliged to flee with the newborn Infant, already object of a fatal search. She lost Him in the temple for three inexpressibly painful days; She met Him on the road to Calvary, and the sight indeed pierced Her heart. She saw Him die, heard His final cry, and witnessed the opening of His side with the effusion of His last drops of blood, mingled with water; She received in Her arms the inert body of the most beautiful of the sons of men. Finally, She was obliged to depose Him in a tomb, leave Him there and return with Her adopted son, John, to a deicidal Jerusalem."

"The Queen of Martyrs has never ceased to encourage Her children on earth to bear their own crosses, which complement the Passion of Christ. He suffered first the ordinary contradictions of life; for three years He was taunted and regarded as a menace by those who should have recognized Him and His mission. He knew hunger, cold and fatigue; He slept so heavily in a boat amid a tempest, that we can only suppose He was exhausted. He knew what it was to be abandoned in need and to lose, to the empire of various passions, followers He had called His. Christ is our forerunner in all human sorrows and difficulties. Mary, as His Mother, offered to God with Him all the afflictions of His earthly life, and She continues to offer those of the Church, for its sanctification, for the souls in Purgatory and the salvation of souls."

Special devotions are dedicated to the spiritual martyrdom of Mary, Mother of God, and her compassion with the sufferings of her Divine Son, Jesus. In her suffering as co-redeemer, she reminds us of the tremendous evil of sin and shows us the way of true repentance. May the numerous tears of the Mother of God be conducive to our salvation; with which tears Thou, O God, art able to wash away the sins of the

ST. NICHOLAS OF TOLENTINO, CONFESSOR

Monday, September 10 - 8:00 a.m. Mass

Born in 1246 in Sant'Angelo, Italy, Nicholas of Tolentino took his name from St. Nicholas of Myra, at whose shrine his parents prayed to have a child. Nicholas became an Augustinian friar at the age of 18 after hearing the preaching of an Augustinian hermit. He was ordained seven years later and quickly gained a reputation as a great preacher and confessor.

He practiced severe mortifications and fasted strictly. He was known for obtaining healings for many of the sick who lived in Tolentino, where he spent the last 30 years of his life.

There are many legends related to St. Nicholas, including; The devil once beat Nicholas with a stick, which was then displayed for years in his church. In yet another, Nicholas, who was a vegetarian was served a roasted fowl, for which he made the sign of the cross, and it flew out a window. Nine passengers on a ship going down at sea once asked Nicholas' aid, and he appeared in the sky, wearing the black Augustinian habit, radiating golden light, holding a lily in his left hand, and with his right hand, he quelled the storm. He was also reported to have resurrected over one hundred dead children, including several who had drowned together.

An apparition of the saint, it is said, once saved the burning palace of the Doge of Venice by throwing a piece of blessed bread on the flames. The blessed bread became famous and is referred to as St. Nicholas' bread; a roll of dough with a cross in the center. It has its origin in the bread he used to give to the sick to eat after he had prayed for the Virgin Mary's healing intercession.

During his life, Nicholas is said to have received visions, including many images of Purgatory, which friends ascribed to his lengthy fasts. Prayer for the souls in Purgatory was the outstanding characteristic of his spirituality. Because of Nicholas' devotion and connection to the holy souls, he was proclaimed patron of the souls in Purgatory, in 1884 by Leo XIII.

St. Nicholas died September 10, 1306 and was canonized by Pope Eugene IV in 1446.
His Feast day: September 10.
