Sunday, September 16, 2018 - Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

September - The Month of Our Lady of Sorrows

The Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin

Pius VII, by his Decree of September 18, 1814, extended to the whole Church the Feast of Our Lady of Seven Sorrows, or Dolors, which had been granted to the Servite Order in 1688. On this September 15 feast, the sorrows of the Blessed Virgin are presented to us as the sole object of our contemplation, and we are at liberty to consider all the trials of her life of martyrdom, the source of so much joy and so many blessings to ourselves; all the sufferings of Mary come from her desire to share in the sufferings of Jesus.

The Church, in commemorating Mary's sufferings emphasizes her great and courageous love which caused her to be so closely associated with the work of our Redemption. Like Judith, the Virgin Mother, faced with the distress and tribulation of her people, spared nothing to save us from ruin. By offering her Son for us, she became our Mother and we became her children. That is why the Epistle for the day is from the Book of Judith, but is to be applied to Mary.

The short Gospel for the Mass of the Seven Sorrows shows Jesus entrusting His Mother to St. John, and therefore to all of us, signifying the beginning of her maternal mission in our regard.

The Seven Sorrows of Our Lady are: The Prophecy of Simeon; The Flight into Egypt; The Loss of Jesus in the Temple; The Meeting of Jesus and Mary on the Way of the Cross; The Crucifixion; The Taking Down of the Body of Jesus from the Cross; and Jesus is laid in the Tomb.

There are many different devotions--prayers, litanies, novenas, consecrations, Via Matris (Way of Mary) and rosary chaplet--that honor the seven sorrows. Devotion to the sorrows of Mary is recommended by St. Bridget of Sweden, St. Alphonsus Liguori, and St. Gabriel Possenti, for souls who wish to rid themselves of sinful habits, and those desiring sanctity. Those who sincerely employ her aid through meditation on her sorrows can expect great consolations, confidence in God's mercy, the special protection of the Blessed Mother at the hour of temptation, and at death.

The Ember Days of the Liturgical Cycle

Four times a year, the Church sets aside three days to focus on God through His marvelous creation. These quarterly periods take place around the beginnings of the four natural seasons. These four times are each kept on a successive Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday and are known as "Ember Days," or *Quatuor Tempora*, in Latin. The first of these four times comes in Winter, after the Feast of St. Lucy; the second comes in Spring, the week after Ash Wednesday; the third comes in Summer, after Pentecost Sunday; and the last comes in Autumn, after the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

These times are spent fasting and partially abstaining (voluntary since the new Code of Canon Law) in penance and with the intentions of thanking God for the gifts He gives us in nature, and beseeching Him for the discipline to use them in moderation. The fasts, known as *Jejunia quatuor temporum*, or "the fast of the four seasons," are rooted in Old Testament practices of fasting four times a year.

A 13th century Dominican, Blessed Jacopo de Voragine, Archbishop of Genoa, gives us interesting reasons to fast during the Ember Days:

Then let us fast in March which is printemps (spring) for to repress the heat of the flesh boiling, and to quench luxury or to temper it. In summer we ought to fast to the end that we chastise the burning and ardour of avarice. In harvest for to repress the drought of pride, and in winter for to chastise the coldness of untruth and of malice.

For these fastings here begin in March in the first week of the Lent, to the end that vices wax dry in us, for they may not all be quenched; or because that we cast them away, and the boughs and herbs of virtues may grow in us. And in summer also, in the Whitsun week, for then cometh the Holy Ghost, and therefore we ought to be fervent and esprised in the love of the Holy Ghost. They be fasted also in September before Michaelmas, and these be the third fastings, because that in this time the fruits be gathered and we should render to God the fruits of good works. In December they be also, and they be the fourth fastings, and in this time the herbs die, and we ought to be mortified to the world.

Ember Days are days favored for priestly ordinations, prayer for priests, first Communions, almsgiving and other penitential and charitable acts, and prayer for the souls in Purgatory. In light of the current crisis in the Church, Bishop Morlino of the Diocese of Madison, WI recently said: "I ask that all priests, clergy, religious, and diocesan employees join me in observing the upcoming Autumn Ember Days (Sep. 19, 21, and 22) as days of fasting and abstinence in reparation for the sins and outrages committed by members of the clergy and episcopacy and I invite all the faithful to do the same. Some sins, like some demons, can only be driven out by prayer and fasting."


