The Maternity of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary

Thursday, October 11

8:00 a.m. Mass



Holy Church often institutes feasts into the liturgical cycle that teach us a specific dogma. The glorious Feast of the Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of these. The Divine Maternity was infallibly declared and defined at the Council of Ephesus in 431, but it took 1,500 years before October 11 was chosen as the day of celebration for the feast day by Pius XI in 1931.

Even before the Council of Ephesus had struck with anathema anyone who would dare to deny Mary her title of "Mother of God," Saint Gregory Nazianzen, a Doctor of the Church who died forty-two years before that Council, had already declared the traditional Catholic doctrine in these words:

If anyone does not believe that Holy Mary is Mother of God, he is outside the divine order. If anyone shall say that Christ flowed through the Virgin as through a channel, and was not formed in her in a fashion both divine and human . . . such a one too is an atheist. If anyone shall say that (in the case of Christ) first a man was made and that afterwards God entered into Him, he is subject to damnation.

Therefore, all Catholics believe that Mary is the Mother of God. This does not mean that she is not a creature of God, nor that God did not exist before she was created. It means that He who was her Son was a Divine Person. In Christ there are two natures; the nature of God (divine), and the nature of man (human), called the hypostatic union. But there is only one Person, a Divine Person, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. The Catholic Church tells us that in order to be saved we must believe with our full hearts that the same Person Who is the Son of God the Eternal Father in His Divine nature is also the Child of Mary the Virgin in His human nature. In this mortal life we cannot fully understand this mystery.

Mary is Virgin of virgins, the unique virgin-mother who gave Jesus his very flesh and blood, and who miraculously gave birth to Her Son without ever losing the attribute of virginity, because Her Son is God and the Son of God, Who has a Father in eternity and none in time. It was also in view of her predestined Divine Maternity that she was preserved free from the stain of Original Sin from the very moment of her conception. This privilege of Mary--namely, her dignity as Mother of God--is the foundation of all her other titles, dignities, and graces. It is the first title of many by which she is recognized in the Litany of Loretto.
