

In America the title of King could sound strange. The concept of a king is something foreign to democratic sensibility. Or perhaps, the difficulty lies in a kind of fairy-tale idea about kingship which pictures ermine robes and jeweled crowns and all sorts of pomp. The kingship of Jesus we celebrate today is not fake, not gone.

Who, or what, rules our life? Who, or what, holds power over our daily choices? It might be a career, or a debt, or desires, or friendships.

We have to turn toward the King who is our Savior and our hope, our liberator and our advocate. This King comes into our world in unexpected and quiet ways and conquers with an armed force no one can resist. He conquers, quite simply, with love.

In the Gospel, Jesus told Pilate: "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." Now is the time for us to listen, and to truly hear. Jesus the King calls us to conversion, to renewal, to simplicity, to faith.



ALL SAINTS DAY - NOVEMBER 1

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION ~ MASS 8:00AM & 6:00PM

Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival day in honor of all the saints;

At whose solemnity the angels rejoice, and give praise to the Son of God. --Introit, Ps. 32:1

"I saw a great multitude which no man could number, of all nations and tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne, and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes and palms in their hands; and they cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God who sitteth upon the throne, and to the Lamb." *-Apoc., VII, 9-10*

The custom of keeping holy one day of the year as the festival of all God's saints dates back to at least the beginning of the Fifth Century. Pope St. Boniface IV, when dedicating the Roman Pantheon as the Church of Our Blessed Lady and All Holy Martyrs, appointed November 1 for the chief annual festival. Placed late in the liturgical year it serves as an occasion to anticipate the consummation of Christ's kingdom and His Second Coming.

Throughout the liturgy, a joyous invitation goes out to join in the celebration of this wonderful family feast. There is great rejoicing upon Earth and in Heaven as the Church glances over all her glorified children, assured of their intercession. All in heaven have been cleansed from sin by the blood of the Lamb and carry a palm of victory in their hands. They have gone before us and now, because of their love for us, earnestly intercede for us on our behalf before the throne of God. Thus the wonderful mystery of the Communion of Saints is celebrated; the union of the living with their brethren who have fallen asleep in Christ is not broken in this supernatural unity. The intimacy of the sharing of spiritual benefits gives extra steadiness in holiness to the entire Church.

The goodness and kindness of God is taught to us in the Gospel where He shows us the sure way by which to become saints -- a saint's life is nothing more than the Beatitudes in action. At the Sacrificial Banquet, the beatitudes are nourished and preserved; the blessed Eucharist is the source of their effectiveness. Listening to Christ and teaching us the ways of blessed hope, the holy delights experienced by the glorified in Heaven are a foretaste of perfect bliss for us as well, if we but follow Him.

ALL SOULS DAY - NOVEMBER 2

"We will not have you ignorant, brethren, concerning them that are asleep, that you be not sorrowful, even as others who have no hope." -I Thess. IV-3.

The feasts of Christ the King and All Saints are intimately connected with the commemoration of the Church Suffering. The Holy Souls detained in purgatory to expiate their sins or the temporal punishment due those sins are nevertheless confirmed in grace and one day they will enter heaven. It is a duty of justice and charity incumbent on every Christian by virtue of his membership in the Mystical Body of Christ to pray for the Church Suffering. It is also a consequence of the dogma of the Communion of Saints that the prayers and merits of Christians benefit those in purgatory.

Holy Mother Church commemorates All Souls Day on Friday, Nov. 2nd.

Three Requiem Masses are celebrated at; 9:30am, 12:00pm & 6:00pm.

On All Souls Day the Church is praying for all the faithful departed who have yet to be purified in Purgatory before entering heaven. The Church remembers them throughout the entire month of November in her prayers and also invites the faithful to pray for the dead especially those of our family. Please don't forget to pray also for the deceased priests & bishops (because they may have no one who remembers them or keeps them in their prayers).

SATURDAY - NOVEMBER 3

On Saturday, November 3, there will be a **Requiem Mass at 9:00am** for the deceased of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest, including; Priests, Seminarians, Oblates, Sisters & Members of the Sacred Heart Society.



Indulgences for the Benefit of Poor Souls

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory is granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

The indulgence is plenary each day from November 1 through November 8; on other days of the year it is partial.

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on All Souls Day, November 2nd, as well as on the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day, piously visit a church.

In visiting the church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

To acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary to have no attachment to sin, even venial and also to fulfill the following three conditions:

~Sacramental Confession ~

~Eucharistic Communion~

~Prayer for the Holy Father's intentions~

Along with detachment from all sin

These conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, only fitting that Holy Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father said on the same day as the visit.

The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of a day.

The "Eternal Rest" prayer is appropriate for each day
Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; and let the perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
