Let us keep vigilant.

Keeping vigil is filled with moments of peace and joy. It prevents us from falling asleep. So, there needs to be a good reason for a vigil. Suppose that we are expecting a visitor for whom it is worth waiting, a person of quality. For this, we will not hesitate to disrupt our daily routine, our schedule, our life.

This is why Advent is a vigil. We are preparing a place of honor for a guest for whom the feast is offered.

Is it true that Jesus Christ occupies the place of honor in my affairs? Certainly I cannot give him all of my time, but I can give Him the best of my time! How much of this time do I reserve for Him? Do I know how to receive Him in and thru the sacraments?

When keeping vigil, we often sing to keep our eyes open: this is prayer.

We keep the fire going which gives light and heat: this is the Holy Eucharist.

When keeping vigil, we confide in Him and empty the depths of our soul: this is the sacrament of Penance.

To keep vigil does not mean to wait for a future which might not come. It is to live each moment as if it has already come. Keeping vigil during Advent is to invite Christ again as our favorite guest.

Advent is short and will pass quickly. That is why a Christian is like a quick strider. He knows how to use his time well, advancing along. To waste his time is to do nothing, or worse, to do worthless things. To do worthless things is to accord too much importance to little trifles, and to give too little to what has value.

Let's go ahead and have a blessed Advent!

THE LITURGICAL AND SPIRITUAL SEASON OF ADVENT

The active participation in the most Holy Mysteries and in the public and solemn prayer of the Church is the primary and indispensable source of the true Christian spirit. -- Pope St. Pius X

Advent, meaning literally a “coming,” is a preparation for the coming of the Savior, a period of personal purification and penance. It is the start of a new liturgical season, the New Year of Holy Mother Church. It’s a new opportunity to intensify and enliven the process of our sanctification by immersing ourselves in the spirit and liturgy of the season. The spiritual life begins with the purgative way and Advent being the first liturgical season is the time to start rooting out vices, learning to control our appetites and to seriously practice virtue.

St. Gregory of Tours wrote that St. Perpetuus who held the See around 480, decreed a fast three times a week from the fest of St. Martin on November 11 until Christmas. The Council of Tours in 567 required monks to fast from the beginning of December until Christmas and the penance was extended to the laity and pushed back to St. Martin’s Day. For us, Advent begins on the Sunday nearest St. Andrew’s Day, November 30. Although no formal fasting is required under pain of sin, the Church does promote the spirit of penance. In the liturgy, the *Gloria* is not said in ferial Masses, purple is the color for vestments to symbolize penance, the organ is not played except on Gaudete Sunday, and the nuptial blessing is not given at marriages until Christmastide.

To help us “make straight the paths of the Lord,” we should remember that Christ comes to us in three different ways. St. Bernard says “He comes in the flesh and in weakness; He comes in spirit and power; and He comes in glory and in majesty.” That is, His first coming on earth was through the Incarnation, His second when He enters our souls through sanctifying grace, and His third will be at our particular judgment and the general judgment at the end of the world.

We should clean up our soul through the Sacrament of Penance, scrubbing it bright with self-imposed, rough-edged mortifications. And we should decorate and clothe our souls with sanctifying grace through the reception of the Holy Eucharist. Children can be taught quite early on to offer up their little sacrifices for the coming of the Christ Child, and their daily treats, candy, and parties postponed until Christmas actually arrives.

By keeping the true spirit and intent of Advent, we extend the real season of Christmastide, and it will be far more spiritually efficacious and satisfying, our celebrations more meaningful, and our feasting all the more merry.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception

In the Constitution Ineffabilis Deus of 8 December, 1854, Pius IX pronounced and defined that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin."

Novena to the Immaculate Conception

November 29 - December 7

O most holy Virgin who wast pleasing to God and didst become His Mother. Immaculate in your body, in your soul, in your faith and in your love, we beseech thee to look graciously upon the wretched who implore thy powerful protection. The wicked serpent, against whom the primal curse was hurled, continues none the less to wage war and to lay snares for the unhappy children of Eve. Ah, do thou, our blessed Mother, our Queen and Advocate, who from the first instant of thy conception didst crush the head of our enemy, receive the prayers that we unite single-heartedly to thine and conjure thee to offer at the throne of God, that we may never fall into the snares that are laid for us, in such wise that we may all come to the haven of salvation; and in the midst of so many dangers may holy Church and the fellowship of Christians everywhere sing once more the hymn of deliverance, victory and peace. Amen.

Thou art all fair, O Mary. And the original stain is not in thee. Thou art the glory of Jerusalem. Thou art the joy of Israel. Thou art the honour of our people. Thou art the advocate of sinners. O Mary, virgin most prudent, mother most tender, pray for us. Intercede for us with Jesus Christ Our Lord.

V. In thy conception, O Virgin, thou wast immaculate.

R. Pray for us to the Father, Whose Son thou didst bring forth.

Let us pray.

O God who, by the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin, didst make her a worthy habitation for Thy Son, and didst, by His foreseen death, preserve her from all stain of sin; grant we beseech Thee, that through her intercession we may be cleansed from sin and come with pure hearts to Thee. Through the same Christ Our Lord. (*Amen.*)


