## Rejoice!

Let's think about that: the virtue of hope is more than just optimism or positive thinking. Hope and joy are rooted in the promises of Christ, who doesn't promise the ultimate happiness in this life, but in the next.

The joy of Gaudete Sunday does not consist in ignoring the difficulties and trials of this earthly life but rather in rejoicing no matter what the external circumstances are. In fact, the darker the world becomes, the more the world is in need of the Light. Look around you and see the presence of God, despite the difficulties we are in. Remember the last line of the message Jesus sent back to St. John the Baptist in prison, "Happy the man who does not lose faith in me".

The message of joy given today is not a magical pink candy which is too good to be true. It reminds me of an episode from the life of Saint Therese of the Little Flower. By the door of her cell, in the Carmelite Convent of Lisieux, scratched into the wood she had written, "Jesus is my only love". It was not written in a time of exultation and enthusiasm, but rather in a time when she was in the midst of difficulties, in major despair. She was thus crying out to her beloved. Even when she experienced nothing but absence, emptiness, and darkness, she clung to Jesus, in the assurance of being loved by Him. That is faith and our source of joy.

## Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday)

*Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice -- Philippians 4:14*

The worldly-minded man finds nothing joyful in Christianity; he is miserable and unhappy, seeking solace only in worldly gains. But Christianity furnishes us with the necessary means for our reconciliation with God, for our purification, sanctification, and justification. If we had no Mass, no sanctifying grace, no sacraments, we would have no peace of heart, and abundant wretchedness and despair.

The Apostle St. Paul to the Philippians says, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice." When he exhorts us to rejoice in the Lord, the Apostle wishes this joy to consist in being united with Jesus by His grace and love. Those in the state of grace can rejoice that their reward in heaven will be great, that Jesus loves them, and they Him.

But how is it possible to rejoice always, since our life on earth is a warfare full of bitterness, numberless crosses, struggles, and afflictions? The good Christian rejoices in tribulations and afflictions, for faith tells him "that which is at present momentary and light of our tribulation worketh of us above measure exceedingly an eternal weight of glory." -- *I. Cor. 4:17*. The Christian rejoices even though he has no certainty that he has obtained forgiveness, yet hope sustains him because he knows that God does not reject a repentant sinner. He rejoices in all struggles and in all uncertainties for he knows he has the necessary means to overcome all temptations and persevere in the grace of God. What a difference between a worldling and a true Christian!

If we can each say in truth: I am a good Christian, I believe all that the Catholic Church teaches, and all that she commands, then we have a well-grounded hope of eternal life. But if we must confess that we are anything but good Christians, we have reason to fear that eternal damnation will be our inheritance. The longer we live for the world, the longer we abide in sin, the fainter grows the hope of our ever becoming true Christians. Now is the time. The holy season of Advent draws to its close; let us not delay to purify and renew ourselves, that we may become what we can and will become, true Christians to rejoice always!

### ☉ Antiphons

The seven "O Antiphons are chanted prayers that come from the Breviary's Vespers during the Octave *before* Christmas *Eve*. Each Antiphon begins with "O" and addresses Jesus with a unique title which comes from the prophecies of Isaias and Micheas (Micah). They can be prayed in the home in Latin or English, family gathered around, in a fervent appeal for the coming of the Messias, and are found in the 1962 missal.

December 17: O Wisdom that comest out of the mouth of the Most High, that reachest from one end to another and orderest all things mightily and sweetly, come to teach us the way of prudence!

December 18: O Adonai, and Leader of the house of Israel, who didst appear to Moses in the flame of the burning bush, and didst give unto him the law on Sinai: come and with an outstretched arm redeem us.

December 19: O Root of Jesse, who standest for an ensign of the people, before whom kings shall keep silence, and unto whom the Gentiles shall make their supplication: come to deliver us and tarry not.

December 20: O Key of David, and Scepter of the house of Israel, who openest and no man shutteth, who shuttest and no man openeth: come and bring forth from his prisonhouse, the captive that sitteth in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 21: O Dawn of the East, brightness of the light eternal, and Sun of Justice, come and enlighten them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22: O King of the Gentiles and the desired of them, Thou cornerstone that makest both one, come and deliver man, who Thou didst form out of the dust of the earth.

December 23: O Emmanuel, our King and Lawgiver, the expected of the nations and their Savior, come to save us, O Lord our God.

Eternal Father, I offer to Thine honor and glory, for my eternal salvation and for the salvation of the whole world, the pain which the divine Child Jesus felt in His tender Body, when He submitted to the rite of circumcision: I offer Thee that Precious Blood which He then first shed for the salvation of all mankind.

Eternal Father, I offer to Thine honor and glory, for my eternal salvation and for the salvation of the whole world, the humility, mortification, patience, charity and all the virtues of the Child Jesus; I thank Thee, I love Thee, and I bless Thee infinitely for this ineffable mystery of the Incarnation of the Word of God.
