Where do we find Christ?

In this feast of Epiphany—which means, literally, “manifestation”—right off the bat we are forced to look more deeply at the season we have just celebrated in order to find God made manifest in our world. Where is the one who is the reason for the season?

Amid the darkness, Christ is discovered where there is light. A star guides the way to the place where this new king is found. The point is clear: If you want to find Him, follow that light. It’s difficult to do in a world so often overcome by shadows and darkness.

Where is the Christ? Follow the light. There you will find Him, our ultimate source of light and redemption and hope. **He is often found where we don't expect him.**

If the first words spoken in this Gospel offer us a profound challenge, the last ones offer profound hope. The Magi, we’re told, had to “go home by another way.” An encounter with Christ means we need to change direction.

I can’t think of a better message from the Magi—or for the start of a new year. “Where do we find the newborn King of the Jews?” Herod’s answer to the Magi still speaks to us: “Search diligently.” If we open our eyes, and open our hearts, we will find Him. He will be made manifest, perhaps in ways we never imagined. We will share in the greatest epiphany of all. And then, like the Magi, we will find our way home...by another way.

Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord

The Feast of the Epiphany is the continuation of the mystery of Christmas. It appears on the Calendar of the Church with its own special character although in the United States it is a non-obligatory holy feast. Its very name, which signifies Manifestation, implies that it celebrates the apparition of God to his creatures. It is also the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. In the Eastern Church it is known as the "Theophany," meaning "appearance of God."

The Epiphany is indeed great for it shares with the Feasts of Christmas, Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost, the honor of being called, in the Canon of the Mass, *a Day most holy*. The joy caused us by the Birth of our Jesus must be renewed on it, for, as though it were a second Christmas Day, it shows us our Incarnate God in a new light. It leaves us all the sweetness of the dear Babe of Bethlehem, who hath appeared to us already in love; but to this it adds its own grand manifestation of the divinity of our Jesus. At Christmas, it was a few Shepherds that were invited by the Angels to go and recognize THE WORD MADE FLESH; but now, at the Epiphany, the voice of God himself calls the whole world to adore this Jesus, and to hear him.

The mystery of the Epiphany brings upon us three magnificent rays of the Sun of Justice. There are united in the Epiphany the three manifestations of Jesus' Glory: the mystery of the Magi coming from the East, under the guidance of a star and adoring the Infant of Bethlehem as the Divine King; the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, who, while standing in the waters of the Jordan, was proclaimed by the Eternal Father as Son of God -- when Saint John baptized the Lamb of God the heavens were opened and the Holy Ghost appeared as a Dove over the head of Christ, and the Father's voice was heard: "This is My Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" -- ; and thirdly, the mystery of the divine power of this same Jesus, when he changed the water into wine at the wedding of Cana.

Saint Gregory Nazianzen sermonized over 1,600 years ago that on the Epiphany, "The heavens like Paradise with its flaming sword, closed by Adam for himself and his descendants, are rent open. The Spirit comes to Him {Jesus} as to an equal, bearing witness to His Godhead. A voice bears witness to Him from heaven, His place of origin. The Spirit descends in bodily form like a dove that so long ago announced the ending of the flood and so gives honor to the body that is one with God."

We ought to spend this holy day with great solemnity and religious feeling. Let us remember with joy and gratitude the gift of the Incarnation. May the light of Christ shine in our hearts and in our lives! Let us keep it throughout the year so that the new year can really be a year of grace, marked by the celebration of the mysteries of Our Savior Jesus Christ. Let us go in spirit to the manger of Bethlehem with the Wise Men -- Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar -- and adore our Redeemer. And may our Blessed Mother be always with us, so that we can recognize the signs of her Divine Son.

That day, beloved children, on which Christ, the Savior of the world, for the first time appeared to the Gentiles, is to be venerated with a most holy honor by us also... For that day is not past in such a way that the power of the work which was then revealed should be past as well.
