Be an athlete and love challenge!

Between Epiphany and Lent, there are three Sundays with Latin names: Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima- the seventieth, sixtieth and fiftieth days (*approximately*) before Easter.

The intention of these three weeks is to prepare us to undertake the journey and the labor of the pilgrimage of Lent.

Thus, St. Paul reminds us in this week's Epistle that we are to be like athletes, competing in a struggle - athletes in training, temperate in all things, not aimless, but disciplined, striving for a prize which is immortal. The Gospel likens us to workers in a vineyard. It matters not whether



we have come early in the morning, or at midday, or at the last eleventh hour; we labor for the one reward, which God's free grace provides. Whether the hour be late or early matters not; the point is that now we are called to spiritual reward and we must give up our idleness.

God does not deal with us with strict justice. We thank Him for that. If He did, we would all be lost.

Sunday, February 17, 2019 - Septuagesima Sunday

St. Peter Damian, Doctor of the Church, February 23, 9:00 a.m. Holy Mass

In his late twenties St. Peter Damian was welcomed into the Benedictine hermitage of the Reform of St. Romuald at Fonte-Avellino. Although living in a cloister, Peter watched the Church closely and strove for her purification. He would write to the pope, urging him to deal with the scandals of the Church in Italy. In 1051, Peter published his treatise on the vices of the clergy, "Liber Gomorrhianus." He eventually became Prior of the hermitage and in 1057, Pope Stephen X elevated Peter to cardinal.

It would be impossible to describe the services he rendered to the Church and the Sovereign Pontiffs, 16 in all, during most trying times, by his learning, his prudence as Legate. and his untiring zeal. His life was one continued struggle against simony, and the heresy of the Nicolaites. He purged the Church of Milan of these disorders, and brought her into subjection to the Holy See. He courageously resisted the anti-popes Benedict and Cadolaus. He deterred Henry 4th, King of Germany, from an unjust divorce of his wife. He restored the people of Ravenna to their allegiance to the Roman Pontiff, and absolved them from interdict. He reformed the abuses which had crept in among the Canons of Velletri. The life of the well-traveled holy monk was distinguished by his great learning and a marvelous knowledge of Holy Scripture, and by great penitential acts, which served both as a rebuke and as an inspiration to his fellow monks and the secular clergy at a time in the Church when moral turpitude was rampant in clerical ranks.

He propagated fasting on Fridays in honor of the Holy Cross; the reciting the Little Office of our Lady; keeping Saturday as a day especially devoted to Mary; and taking the discipline in expiation of past sins. He died of a fever on the eighth of the Calends of March (February 23rd), at Faenza. His relics, which are kept in the Cistercian Church of that town, are devoutly honored by the faithful, and many miracles are wrought at the holy shrine.
