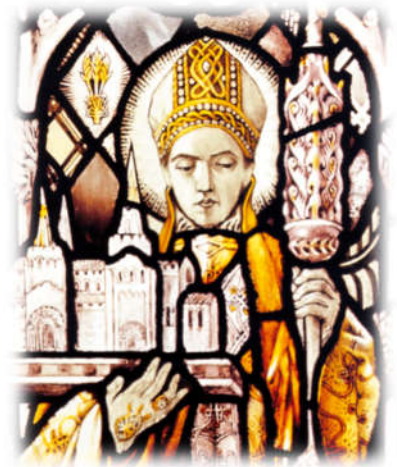
Feast of St. Chad, March 2

Brother of Saint Cedd and Saint Cynibild and missionary monk to Ireland with Saint Egbert, St. Chad was ordained in 653, later becoming Abbot at Lastingham monastery, Yorkshire, England; abbot to Saint Owen. A contemporary, St. Theodore, was so astonished at his humility that he consecrated St. Chad as bishop of Mercians in 669.

As soon as Chad had been consecrated bishop, he began to devote himself to ecclesiastical truth and purity of doctrine and to give attention to the practice of humility, self-denial and study: to travel about, not on horseback, but on foot, after the manner of the apostles, preaching the Gospel in the towns and the open country, in cottages, villages and castles. The humble saint founded monasteries, reformed monastic life in his diocese, and built a cathedral on land that had been the site of the martyrdom of 1,000 Christians by the pagan Mercians. Miraculous cures were reported at the wells he caused to be dug for the relief of travelers.

Tradition says that on one occasion two of the king's sons were hunting, and were led by their quarry to the oratory of Saint Chad where they found him praying. They were so impressed by the sight of the frail old man upon his knees, his face glowing with rapture, that they knelt, asked his blessing, and converted. The pagan King Wulfhere was so angry that he slew his own sons, and hunted down Saint Chad for more of the same. But as he approached the bishop's cell, a great light shone through its single window, and the king, almost blinded by its brightness, abandoned his plan for revenge.

During storms, Chad would go to chapel and pray continually, explaining, "God thunders forth from heaven to rouse people to fear the Lord, to call them to remember the future judgment...when God will come in the clouds in great power and majesty to judge the living and the dead."



The Church traditionally dedicates the month of March to the special veneration of St. Joseph, whose feast day is March 19th. "He was chosen by the eternal Father as the trustworthy guardian and protector of his greatest treasures, namely, his divine Son and Mary, Joseph's wife. He carried out this vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him, saying 'Good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord.'" - St. Bernardine of Siena. Due to St. Joseph's leadership of the Holy Family, he has been declared the protector and patron of the universal Catholic Church.
