Let us be witnesses.

The devil is real and we must be on our guard. The greatest achievement of the devil is that he has deceived so many into thinking that he does not exist! He is very happy to be thought of as a cute little red guy with catlike ears, a pointy tail, and matching pitchfork. Of course, he does exist, but deception is second nature to him, for he is the "Father of Lies."



Jesus tells us today, "He who is not with me is against me; and he who gathers not with me, scatters." It is good for us to receive such teaching, because one of the greatest errors of our time is the idea that "compromise" is always a good and virtuous thing. We are in the world but we are not of the world. We have to earn a living. We have to live in peace with our neighbor; these people around us may not be Catholic, but that must not change the nature of our faith, of our behavior, nor our responsibilities. If we must earn our living among pagans, that is not an excuse to be a pagan.

Nonetheless, all of our responsibilities in the world ought to be carried out with the intention of "having the Word of God and keeping it". We cannot keep the Commandments by only keeping a few of them; nor by keeping most of them; not even by keeping the most "popular" ones. The demands of truth and morality operate at all the levels of our society. As baptized Catholics, particularly if we have been confirmed, we have the duty to support objective truth and morality. Each of us has the duty to keep the Commandments, and sometimes we have an obligation to remind others of the same responsibilities-politely and tactfully, of course, but firmly.

Let us ask our Blessed Mother for the strength to be courageous witnesses of the Faith. She is indeed blessed because, by fidelity to the Word of God, she deflected the devil and cast him away from the world.

The Feast of the Annunciation

Monday, March 25, 8:00 a.m. Mass

On the Feast of the Annunciation, a day to be spent in joy, we celebrate her in whom the Word was made flesh, in whom the son of God united Himself forever to our humanity in order to enable us to share in His Divinity. Through the mystery of the Incarnation, Mary obtained her most wondrous title of the Mother of God. Through it she became the Mother of Christians, for through her *fiat* as Mother of the Word Incarnate she was associated with the entire redemptive work of her Son.

In contrast with the curse provoked by Eve, Mary is declared to be "blessed among women," the Archangel Gabriel informs her of the tremendous plans of God for her. Through her God will give the promised Redeemer to the world. With the assurance that the miraculous birth will not impair her virginity Mary accepts, and the mystery of the union between God and man is accomplished in her by the power of the Holy Spirit. Mary, a daughter of Eve shares not Eve's sin. Eve was foolish, Mary wise; Eve was proud, Mary humble; Eve gave of the tree of death, Mary gives of the Tree of Life.



ST. JOHN OF CAPISTRANO March 28

St. John of Capistrano (1385-1456) was born in Capistrano, Italy. After the death of his father, his mother sent him to study law in Perugia where he rose to prominence. He achieved great success as a lawyer and was appointed governor of Perugia. He was an upright leader who refused bribes and corruption. While attempting to negotiate a peace treaty he was imprisoned, which gave him opportunity to assess the direction of his life and the state of his soul.

After having a vision of St. Francis of Assisi, John left the world and entered religious life as a Franciscan friar. He was taught theology by St. Bernardine of Siena, and together the two worked to reform the Franciscan order. St. John traveled throughout Italy preaching for the salvation of souls, combating the heresies of his day, and winning many souls away from schism and heresy. Merchants would suspend their business as great crowds gathered to hear him preach in the public squares. He was also known as a healer, and many of the sick were brought to him to be cured. St. John was frequently used as an ambassador by the Holy See which allowed him to preach across the Holy Roman Empire, earning him the name "Apostle of Europe." He also preached a crusade against the Muslim Turks for the emancipation of Hungary. He was present at the Battle of Belgrade and led the charge of the Christian army under a banner monogrammed with the Holy Name of Jesus, to which he had a great devotion, urging the crusaders to invoke the name of Jesus for success in battle. The victory of the Christian army was attributed to his efforts. St. John of Capistrano is the patron of judges, military chaplains, lawyers, and jurists.
