Laetare Sunday - Rejoice!

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as "Laetare Sunday," from the opening words of the Introit (entrance hymn) - "Rejoice." You will note the rose colored vestments - a little less somber than the purple worn for most of Lent.



The color change indicates that Lent is about half over, and suggests that it is a good day to take a "breather" from the Lenten exercises, and then to get back to it on Monday, making the best Lent you can until Easter Sunday. "Laetare" - rejoice not so much that Lent is half over, but that we are much closer to the celebration of our Lord's resurrection!

During this period of Lent we should visit the Blessed Sacrament more often. He is always there, in the tabernacle, waiting for us. We can also make what is called a "Spiritual Communion" by desiring to receive Him if it were possible.

On Laetare Sunday, because we have hope in Jesus, we rejoice; we have been freed from sin by Christ and we are moving with Jesus toward eternal life; from now on we can see our existence with joy!

SAINT FRANCIS OF PAOLA

PRAY FOR US



APRIL 2ND

{1416-1507}



St. Francis of Paola (1416-1507) was born in Calabria, Italy, to a husband and wife known for their holiness. After suffering childlessness for many years, his parents had recourse to prayer, especially the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi. They eventually had three children, and the eldest, Francis, was named after St. Francis in thanksgiving for his birth. Francis of Paola grew in sanctity, and after having a vision of St. Francis he spent a year in a Franciscan convent to fulfill a vow his parents had made to the saint. After his time there, he returned to his parents and accompanied them on a pilgrimage to Assisi. Upon returning home, Francis retired to a private spot on his parents' estate to live as a hermit. He later moved his dwelling to a lonely cave by the sea, living there in prayer, solitude and mortification for six years. Disciples gradually came to him to imitate his manner of life, so many that St. Francis of Paola, with the permission of his bishop, built a monastery and church to accommodate them. He later obtained permission from the Holy See to found a new religious order called the Minims, or "The Least," as they were to live hidden lives of poverty, abstinence, and humility. St. Francis of Paola became famous and was sought out by others for his prophecies and miracles. He spent the last three months of his life in solitude in preparation for his death. On Good Friday, after receiving Last Rites, he died while the Passion of Christ was read to him aloud. His feast day is April 2.
