Let us be prepared!

This Sunday is called "Passion Sunday" because during the two weeks before Easter, the liturgy concentrates on the suffering and death of Jesus to atone for our sins.

I would like to encourage you, dear brethren, to attend the 10 a.m. liturgy of Palm Sunday during which we have the blessing and procession of the Palms. The liturgical services on Holy Thursday, with the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the priesthood; Good Friday, with the greatest love story of all time; Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, with the joy of the Resurrection of Christ and the truth of our faith are also extremely important to attend.

I must insist that the Holy Week liturgies be attended by all because every year I notice that only about half those who come to Mass each Sunday (at the 8 and 10 o'clock Masses) come to the Triduum of Holy Week, perhaps because you are too busy with your worldly activities and not enough aware that the mysteries celebrated from Palm Sunday to Easter are so important.

Jesus' Passion introduces us into a great mystery in which love is redeeming, or rather in which the One who is Love dispenses His love up to the loss of Himself and, doing so, redeems us.

Easter is the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, and one simply cannot experience the proper joy of the feast unless one has walked with Christ and commemorated His institution of the Mass, His agony, passion and death on the cross.

Let us be prepared!

Passiontide

Veiling the Cross

During *Passiontide*, starting on Passion Sunday and ending on Good Friday, you will notice purple cloths draped over the crucifixes, statues and images of saints in the church.

The custom of veiling religious images is a way of focusing on the penitential aspect of this liturgical season. It reminds us in a visual way that our faith in all its glory is made possible only through the work of Christ in his suffering and death on the cross. When we cover these holy and sacred images that we are so accustomed to, we are confronted and reminded in a poignant way of all that Christ has won for us.

Then, as in a dramatic unveiling, the holy images are again revealed for the Easter Vigil to mark the end of the penitential season. The joy of the Easter season and the hope of the Resurrection then comes to the forefront.



Temporarily veiling the crosses and religious images in the penitential color of Lent is a beautiful custom that helps us to reflect on the deeper theological meaning of the liturgical season.

- **CRUCIFIXES & IMAGES VEILED:** Passion Sunday
- **CRUCIFIXES REVEALED:** Good Friday
(to emphasize Jesus' death on the Cross on that day)
- **IMAGES & STATUES REVEALED:** Easter Vigil
(the evening of Holy Saturday)

• **WHY:** In covering the religious images during the height of Lent, all attention is centered on the Passion and death of Christ. This is why the only images NOT to be covered are the Stations of the Cross.

Just as the Church simplifies the sanctuary in these last weeks of Lent in order to focus on the penitential aspect of the season, we can also simplify our homes in creative ways by draping purple clothes over our crucifixes and other holy images. It reminds us that Jesus hid his glory during his Passion, so too we hide away our religious items in order to prepare ourselves to focus on and honor his Passion.

Holy Week Announcement

In regard to the Holy Week's Liturgy, please take note of the following announcement:

Last year we received permission from the Pontifical Commission Ecclesia Dei in Rome to celebrate the Liturgy of Holy Week according to the liturgical books in use before any changes were made. All the apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King are included with other *Ecclesia Dei* communities in this indulgence.

This older form of the ritual and its prayers offer a spirituality that is especially rich and edifying in total conformity with the spirit of the Roman Missal. For the benefit of the faithful, booklets with English translations and explanations are available at the entrance to the church. These booklets will be used on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

Anyone who may have a question concerning this traditional form of the Holy Week Liturgy is welcome to speak with Canon Boucheron for further explanation.
