

SAINT MARTHA PRAY FOR US

JULY 29TH

{1ST CENTURY}



JULY 29 - 8:00 a.m. Mass

St. Martha (1st c.) was a pious Jewish woman from Bethany near Jerusalem. She was a close friend of Jesus during his earthly ministry, as was her brother, St. Lazarus, and her sister, St. Mary of Bethany (St. Mary Magdalene). The Gospels tell us that "Jesus loved Martha, and her sister Mary and Lazarus." Martha would serve the Lord faithfully when he was a guest in her home, once busying herself so much with her work that she neglected to spend time enjoying his presence, for which she earned a gentle rebuke from Our Lord. Martha had great faith in Christ, especially evidenced in her belief that he could raise her brother Lazarus from the dead. In the Gospels we read that St. Martha testified that Jesus was the Son of God even before his Passion and Resurrection.

According to tradition, after the Ascension of Jesus into heaven, St. Martha gathered a group of women together to live, pray, and do penance in common, one of the early Christian houses of consecrated women. St. Martha is the patron of servers, maids, butlers, servants, single laywomen, homemakers, housewives, and cooks. Her feast day is July 29th.

St. Alphonsus Liguori, Doctor of the Church

August 2 - 6:00 P.M. Mass

St. Alphonsus Liguori was the founder of the Redemptorist Order for priests and nuns, a former lawyer, composer, musician, poet, author, scholastic philosopher and theologian. He is the patron saint of arthritis sufferers, confessors, and moralists.

With a brilliant mind he got his doctorate in civil and canon law at age 16. Although he loved the party life, but not sin, after a retreat he recognized a religious calling. After ordination he was renowned for associating with sinners who he saw as souls worthy of salvation. His confessional was always crowded and his sensitivity, which was really a Christ-like love, cleansed thousands and thousands of their sins without severe punishments. He led his congregation through difficult parish events and even devoted himself to religious painting. He was appointed the Bishop of St. Agata, Italy.

Liguori preached many retreats and out in the streets, reconciling enemies, resolving family disputes, and bringing hardened souls back to the faith. He led missions and composed hymns in praise of God the Father, Baby Jesus and Christmas, the Blessed Virgin, the Eucharist, the Passion, and St. Joseph.

During his lifetime in Naples and Sicily there was an anti-clerical faction that persecuted priests, plus plague and famine. He sold everything he had to feed the poor. He suffered greatly from a permanently bent neck that created a wound on his chest from his chin pressing down. Finally, worn out from his lifetime of work for the Church and while resting, he experienced ecstasies and finally died.

He is most remembered for his full and complete love of God, submission to the will of God, and his dislike of entertainments and luxuries.

MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary is the Immaculate Conception; that is, in preparation for the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Holy Trinity in her womb, she was conceived without the corruption of sin through the infinite merits of her Son, Jesus Christ. Over the centuries, as saints and theologians reflected on how Mary pondered and treasured the sacred events from the life of Christ in her holy heart, as attested in Scripture, her pure heart was recognized as something to be imitated. Devotion to Our Lady's purity of heart began to flower, so much so that in the 17th century St. John Eudes promoted it alongside the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion rose to a new level after the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, when Mary revealed an image of her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco.
