Do we condemn this Pharisee too quickly?



Something has happened in the soul of the Pharisee. He knows he owes everything to God. He is happy to thank heaven. He knows that it is God who helps him become better. He knows it and he says it. Yet, he has a major weak point. He looks at other people with contempt. It would be easy to say that he does this because he sees them as inferior to himself, that he feels superior. But, it is deeper than that.

He looks with contempt at their lack of love, their lack of absolute values, and their spiritual mediocrity. He despises them because he expected a lot from them and he was disappointed. He asked of them a bit more interest in heavenly realities, a higher and wider spiritual vision. He did not get any answer to his request. He longed for spiritual masters and no one showed up.

These disappointments led him to have contempt for others. His error was seeking divine love through men rather than from God Himself. He requested too much from man and not enough from God. He lived in resentment. It is such a pity that he did not rush to the heart of God. He could have asked all that from God and he would have gotten it. He would have won everything.

Someone once said, "You should never ask anything from God other than God Himself." The Pharisee made the wrong choice and he lost everything. The only eternal value is Christ and He is the only one who is able to fulfill us.

Everything is disappointing when it does not come from God.

The Immaculate Heart of Mary Act of Consecration

O Immaculate Heart of Mary, Queen of heaven and earth and tender mother of men, in accordance with thy ardent wish made known at Fatima, I consecrate to thee myself, my brethren, my country and the whole human race. Reign over us and teach us how to make the Heart of Jesus reign and triumph in us and around us as It has reigned and triumphed in thee.

Reign over us, dearest Mother, that we may be thine in prosperity and in adversity, in joy and in sorrow, in health and in sickness, in life and in death. O most compassionate Heart of Mary, Queen of Virgins, watch over our minds and hearts and preserve them from the deluge of impurity which thou didst lament so sorrowfully at Fatima. We want to be pure like thee. We want to atone for the many sins committed against Jesus and thee. We want to call down upon our country and the whole world the peace of God in justice and charity.

Therefore, we promise now to imitate thy virtues by the practice of a Christian life without regard to human respect. We resolve to receive Holy Communion on the first Saturday of every month and to offer thee five decades of the Rosary each day together with our sacrifices of reparation and penance. Amen.

AUGUST - MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

August 22 - 8:00 a.m. Mass

The attention of Christians was early on attracted by the love and virtues of the Heart of Mary. It was, so to speak, at the foot of the Cross that the Christian heart first made the acquaintance of the Heart of Mary. Simeon's prophecy paved the way, and furnished the devotion with one of its favorite formulae and most popular representations — the heart pierced with a sword.

Toward the end of the 11th century, we see slight indications of a regular devotion in a sermon by St. Bernard. Later, St. Thomas Becket practiced a devotion to the joys and sorrows of Mary, initiated by Blessed Hermann (d.1245), one of the first spiritual children of St. Dominic; even later it appeared in St. Bridget's Book of Revelations.

St. Bernardine of Siena (d.1444) was absorbed in the contemplation of the virginal heart, and it is from him that the Church has borrowed the lessons of the Second Nocturn for the feast of the Heart of Mary. St. Francis de Sales speaks of the perfections of this heart, the model of love for God, and dedicated to it his *Theotimus*. But it was reserved to St. John Eudes (d. 1681) to propagate the devotion, along with that of the Sacred Heart, to make it public, and to have a feast celebrated in honor of the Heart of Mary.

With the revelation of the "Miraculous Medal" in 1830 and all the prodigies that followed, and then the establishment of the Archconfraternity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Refuge of Sinners, which spread rapidly throughout the world, the Congregation of Rites finally approved the Office and Mass of the Most Pure Heart of Mary without, however, imposing them upon the Universal Church. Pius XII instituted the feast for the whole Church, so as to obtain by her intercession "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue" (Decree of May 4, 1944).

At Fatima in 1917 the Blessed Virgin Mary made known the principal practices of the Five First Saturday devotion to the little children, which she requested in honor of her Immaculate Heart: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with all the graces necessary for salvation all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me."

ROBINSONVILLE | CHAMPION — In 2009 after a year-long celebration marking the 150th anniversary of the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, The Most Reverend David L. Ricken, DD, JCL rededicated the Diocese of Green Bay to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. By rededicating the diocese to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, said Bishop Ricken, "we simply thank the Lord and the Blessed Mother for all the graces they have poured out upon us, upon this diocese, and upon every pilgrim who has come here to pray and be nourished. The Blessed Mother will be special to this place, hopefully forever, and she is definitely a sign of hope to our world."

From St. Boniface to Most Precious Blood of Jesus

After 25 years at St. Boniface Church on East Street, the end of June 2019 saw the Latin Mass in the Diocese of Pittsburgh move to a new, permanent home; Most Precious Blood of Jesus Parish.

On Sunday, August 4, 2019 beginning with the imposition of the stole by Bishop David Zubik (*former Bishop of Green Bay*) at the entrance to the church, Canon William Avis was formally installed as the first pastor of Most Precious Blood of Jesus Parish. Canon Avis' Profession of Faith and Oath of Fidelity were followed by a ceremony in which the new pastor was led by the bishop to the tabernacle, to ring the sanctuary bells, to open the church doors, and then to the baptismal font, a confessional, and the pulpit. Following his installation, Canon Avis celebrated a Solemn Mass, with Canon Matthew Talarico acting as deacon and Canon John O'Connor as subdeacon. Congratulations!
