## INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST

### Is Jesus my King?

The universal kingship of Christ is a great truth of the faith.

In the Incarnation and Redemption purchased by Jesus Christ, all is made new. However, the concept of a king is something foreign to our democratic sensibility. Or perhaps the difficulty lies in a kind of fairy-tale idea about kingship and all sorts of pomp.

But if you think about this question you will discover an obvious truth: In fact, we have many kings. We are dictated to by our own desires, our hunger for more, our hunger for the newest, the largest, the coolest, or the trendiest.

The Church says, "Take another look!" She teaches us to look at the world differently. We are asked to reconsider who or what rules our existence and honor the only king that matters, Jesus Christ.

He is a King so great that He stood before a Roman governor in shackles, wearing a crown of thorns. Yet, in the posture of a prisoner, He was victorious. He is a King so great that He offers Himself to us this day, on the Altar, in simply a sliver of bread. But in this bread, something no bigger than a coin, lives all the hope of the world.

This is our King: Fully present, here and now. *But do we recognize Him?* Pilate asked Jesus if He was a King. Maybe we need to ask: *is Jesus my King?* Or are there others? It's worth asking our self: *who, or what, rules my life? Who, or what, holds power over my daily choices?*

Jesus the King calls us to conversion, to renewal, to simplicity, to faith. It is a kind of regime change that is truly a coup for Christ. Let that be our mission; to be foot soldiers of the Lord. If our lives are crowded with other kings, let us return to the only one who matters. Let us join His kingdom and accept His rule so that His ideals, His aspirations, His Commandments shape our reality, what we think, what we do, what we feel, and what we are.

## Sunday, October 27, 2019-Feast of Christ the King

### DEDICATION TO CHRIST THE KING

O Lord Jesus Christ, I acknowledge Thee King of the Universe. All that has been created has been made for Thee. Exercise upon me all Thy rights. ## Indulgences for the Benefit of Poor Souls

An indulgence, which is applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory is

granted to the faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

**The indulgence is plenary each day from November 1 through November 8; on other days of the year it is partial.**

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on All Souls Day, November 2nd, as well as on the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day, piously visit a church.

In visiting the church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

To acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary to have no attachment to sin, even venial and also to fulfill the following three conditions:

~Sacramental Confession ~

~Eucharistic Communion~

~Prayer for the Holy Father's intentions~

These conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, only fitting that Holy Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father said on the same day as the visit.

The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of a day.

**The "Eternal Rest" prayer is appropriate for each day**  
*Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; and let the perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.*

## ALL SOULS DAY - NOVEMBER 2ND

*The Commemoration of All Faithful Departed (All Souls) sometimes called the Day of the Dead.*

**St. Patrick's Oratory will celebrate a Requiem High Mass at 11:00am with Msgr. Wach on Saturday, November 2.**

On this day, and during the month of November, the Church prays in a special way for the souls of the faithful departed, and individuals pray especially for those whom they have known and loved. The Holy Souls in purgatory died in the mercy of God, thus they are called "holy." However, because they still had attachment to sin at the time of their death, they must undergo the spiritual purification of their souls before they are able to fully love God with their whole heart, mind, and soul for all eternity. As they are nevertheless part of the communion of saints, they depend upon us to help ease their suffering and quickly advance them through their purification so that they can join the saints in heaven. Those in purgatory cannot pray for themselves, this is why they are also called "poor." They can no longer merit anything for themselves and rely entirely on living souls to pray and make sacrifices on their behalf. Please pray for these souls throughout this month.



## ALL SAINTS DAY - NOVEMBER 1

**HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION ~ FRIDAY ~ MASS AT 8:00AM & 6:00PM**

*Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival day in honor of all the saints;*

*At whose solemnity the angels rejoice, and give praise to the Son of God. --Introit, Ps. 32:1*

The custom of keeping holy one day in the year as the festival of all God's saints, whether commemorated in the Liturgy or not, dates back to at least the beginning of the 5<sup>th</sup> Century. In those ancient times it was called the feast of All Holy Martyrs. The day of its celebration varied, as it does to this very day in the Eastern Church.

Pope St. Boniface IV appointed November 1 for the annual festival when he dedicated the Roman Pantheon as a Christian basilica to the Virgin Mary and the Martyrs, transferring numerous remains of martyrs from the Catacombs to a place of rest. (The Pantheon had been dedicated by Agrippa to all pagan gods, so it was a fitting place to entomb the relics of martyrs as an example of the triumph of Christ over false deities.) Pope Gregory IV fixed the date for the whole Church on Nov. 1.

On this day, the Church gives us an admirable vision of heaven in the Epistle. In addition to those whose names are known, Holy Mother Church recalls in a magnificent scene all the others, "of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands," all proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood.

The feast of All Saints is a call to us, and should inspire us with tremendous hope. Among the saints of heaven are some whom we have known. All lived on Earth lives similar to our own. They were baptized, marked with the sign of faith, were faithful to Christ's teaching, and have gone before us to the heavenly home whence they call on us to follow them. The Gospel of the Beatitudes shows the road that they followed; there is no other that will lead us to the same final destination.
