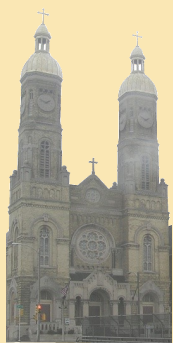
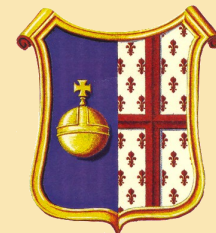

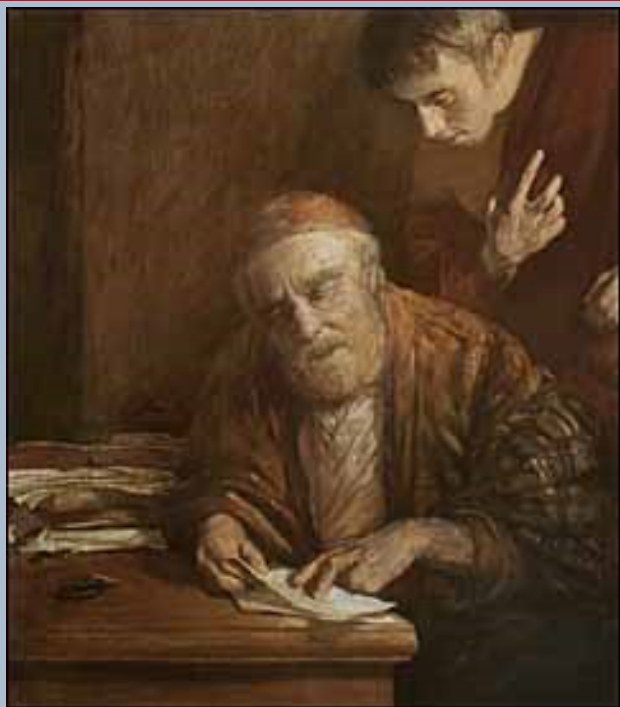

St. Vincent de Paul

Monday, July 19th, is the feast day of St. Vincent de Paul. He is represented in our church by a medallion, the 5th one from the front on the gospel side.

St. Vincent de Paul had a very interesting life after ordination in France, which included being wounded by pirates, sold into slavery and bought by a Moslem in Africa. Our saint converted an apostate Christian and together they crossed the Mediterranean in a small boat. Back in France, St. Vincent de Paul had other fascinating experiences before founding a religious order of priests, the Fathers of the Mission. They are also known as the Lazarists or the Vincentians. Before his death, he saw this institute grow to 25 houses in at least 4 countries. St. Vincent de Paul is the patron of all charitable causes, including the St. Vincent de Paul Society, which he did not start.

St. Kunegunda

This Saturday, July 24th, is the feast of St. Kunegunda. She is represented in our church by the right statue on the side altar, on the gospel side of the sanctuary.

St. Kunegunda is from the 13th century and was the daughter of King Bela IV and niece of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. She married King Boleslaus V of Poland, at age 16. Upon his death, she became a Poor Clare at Sandeck, Poland, in the Convent which she had founded.

St. Kunegunda built churches and hospitals and served the poor and sick. She is also known as St. Kinga and St. Helen of Poland. She is the patron saint of salt miners.

MASS VESTMENTS

At the time of the early Church, the same items of apparel worn now at the altar by the priest were part of ordinary clothing. Over the centuries, fashions changed but the vestments did not. This is symbolic of the continuity of the Church.

The sixth and final item which the priest puts on is the chasuble. The root word, in Latin, is casula, which means "Little House". It is the outer garment that the priest wears for Mass corresponds to the outer garment worn in the late Roman Empire.

The traditional form of the chasuble is called a "fiddleback". It was designed from much larger "gothic" garments in order to make it easier to move to the altar and handle the liturgical vessels. There is often a symbolic cross on the back, which demonstrates that the priest is hanging on the cross. It is sometimes referred to as the yolk of Christ.

JULY LITANY

The litany for July is The Most Precious Blood of Jesus. Having this litany reflects the fact that the feast of The Precious Blood of Jesus is in July. Pope Saint Pius X set the feast day for July 1st. It is still celebrated on that day on the traditional calendar.

We honor the precious blood of Our Savior because that is means He used to redeem us. The blood which was shed by Christ in the Agony, the Scourging, the Crowning with Thorns and His Crucifixion is the price He paid. Heaven was opened for us by His blood.
