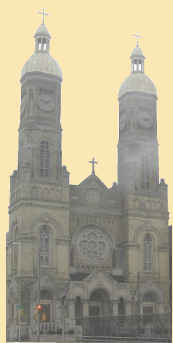
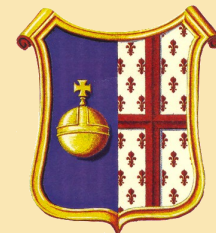

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK



Dear Brethren,

It is quite touching to see Jesus weeping over the City of Jerusalem. It is good for us to look at our Lord and to consider His human nature, His emotions and His feelings. It shows how much God loves us and that He wants our salvation: Jesus' tears are the visible proof of His anxious love for humanity.

The Epistle of Jesus weeping over Jerusalem expresses a truth: God is merciful and compassionate, but He is also just. The price for rejecting Jesus Christ and looking for a worldly king to drive out the Romans was the destruction of this most precious city.

Jerusalem is the figure of our soul: God expects our souls to be thirsting for Him. And, just as there is justice for individuals, there is also justice for nations. As a nation too, we must remain faithful to Jesus Christ. God's favors were taken away from the Jews, so it will be taken away from us if our country refuses to conduct the public affairs in conformity with God's Law. God is faithful but He does expect us to be faithful too.

VESTING FOR MASS

As the priest puts on each one of the six vestment items, he says a prayer in Latin pertaining to that item and his role at the altar. Here is a translation of the prayers which he says for the first two items:

Amice - Lord, set the helmet of salvation on my head to fend off all the assaults of the devil.

Alb - Make me white, O Lord, and cleanse my heart; that being made white in the Blood of the Lamb I may deserve an eternal reward.

JULY LITANY

The litany for July is The Most Precious Blood of Jesus. Having this litany reflects the fact that the feast of The Precious Blood of Jesus is in July. Pope Saint Pius X set the feast day for July 1st. It is still celebrated on that day on the traditional calendar.

We honor the precious blood of Our Savior because that is means He used to redeem us. The blood which was shed by Christ in the Agony, the Scourging, the Crowning with Thorns and His Crucifixion is the price He paid. Heaven was opened for us by His blood.
