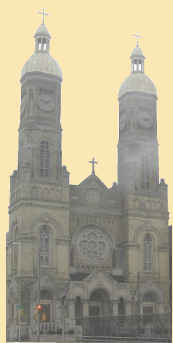

St. John Vianney

Today, August 8th, is the feast day of St. John Vianney. He is depicted in our church in the stained glass window under the choir loft, on the Epistle side of the church. He was not a very bright student in the seminary and was given the very remote French village of Ars, where sin was rampant.

St. John Vianney was used very successfully by God to reform the entire village of 200. It took him eight years just to get everyone to stop doing manual labor on Sundays. The underlying virtue which allowed this to happen was our saint's personal prayer life. As word spread of the holiness of this priest, Ars had thousands of visitors every year and he spent 13-17 hours a day in the confessional.

St. John Vianney died in 1859. He had been a parish priest for 41 years. He was canonized in 1925 and is considered the patron saint of parish priests. Ars still receives over 500,000 visitors a year. When they come, they are blessed by the sight of the incorrupt body of one of the greatest saints in the history of the Church.
