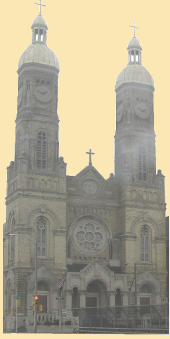

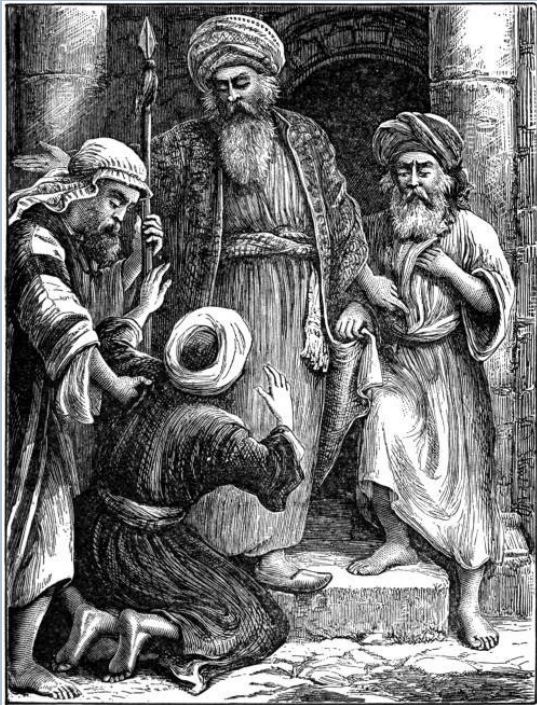

Litany of the Month- October

October is closely associated with Our Lady of the Rosary and Our Lady of Fatima. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th and honors the famous battle of Lepanto. The rosary is a crown of roses. In the middle ages, some monks could not read. Instead of reciting the 150 psalms, as the other monks did, they said 150 Our Fathers. In the 11th century, this changed to 150 Hail Marys and was known as Our Lady's Psalter. St. Dominic received the rosary in its present form directly from the Blessed Virgin Mary in the year 1214. Then, in 1569 Pope St. Pius V set the fifteen mysteries.

The litany for this month is Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady asked for the recitation of the rosary in each of the six Fatima apparitions, culminating with the miracle of the Sun on October 13, 1917. Please take copies of the litany from the pamphlet rack and recite it as a family.

St. Luke the Evangelist

This Monday, October 18th, is the feast of St. Luke. He is represented in our church by his symbol as one of the evangelists. On the cross beam over the sanctuary, his symbol is 2nd from the left and is a winged Ox. The symbol of an ox, or bull, demonstrates sacrifice, service and strength,

St. Luke wrote the 3rd Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. Combined, these represent over 25% of the new testament, making him the largest new testament author. St. Luke was considered an artist and a number of paintings in Italy and elsewhere are attributed to him. Because of his varied occupations during his lifetime, he is considered patron saint of artists, physicians, bachelors, surgeons, students and butchers.

St. John Cantius

This Wednesday, October 20th, is the feast of St. John Cantius or Kanty. He is represented in our church by a medallion, the 3rd from the front on the Epistle side. St. John lived in Poland and spent most of his life as a professor of scripture in Cracow. He also was a parish priest for 8 years and was very much loved by his parishioners. He died on Christmas Eve, 1473, at the age of 77.

During his lifetime, St. John made one pilgrimage to Jerusalem, wishing to be martyred. He also made four pilgrimages to Rome, always on foot. He is the patron saint of Poland and Lithuania.

JOIN THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY

The St. Stanislaus Chapter of the Holy Name Society is an active men's organization designed to provide service to the parish and increase the personal sanctity of the society members. It has 10 membership meetings during the year and goes on a one-day retreat every Lent.
