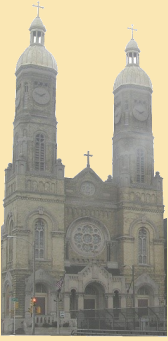

Immaculate Conception

This Wednesday, December 8th, is the feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is represented in our church by the stained glass window in the sanctuary, on the Gospel side. Our Lady is shown standing on a globe covered with 12 stars, with the crescent moon behind, and is crushing a snake, a symbol of the devil. This imagery comes out of the book of the Apocalypse. She is holding a white lily, a symbol of purity. The Immaculate Conception of Mary refers to the fact that she was conceived without original sin.

St. Juan Diego

Juan Diego is the Mexican peasant to whom the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in 1531. It was on his tilma, or cloak, that the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared. The image was miraculously impressed on the rough cloth and this was considered proof of the apparitions authenticity. In our church, he is represented in the 4th stained glass window from the front, on the Epistle side. At the foot of Tepeyac hill, where the apparitions took place, is now the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Over 20 million people visit this site every year, making it one of the world's major pilgrimage destinations.

Our Lady of Loreto

This Friday, December 10th, is the feast day of our Lady of Loreto. She is indirectly represented in our church by the six angels on the ceiling. Each of them represents one of the titles of Our Lady in the Litany of Loreto. Front to back, on the Gospel side, are Tower of Grace, Singular Vessel of Devotion and Seat of Wisdom. Front to back, on the Epistle side, are House of Gold, Gate of Heaven and Mirror of Justice.
