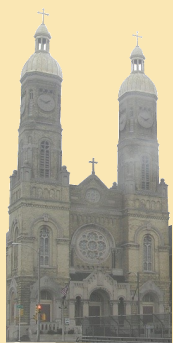

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING & EPIPHANY WATER

ON THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY IT IS CUSTOMARY TO BLESS THE HOME BY INVOKING THE NAMES OF THE THREE MAGI OR WISE MEN, BY WRITING THE FIRST LETTER OF THEIR NAMES (CASPAR, MELCHIOR, BALTHASAR) IN CHALK OVER THE LINTEL (HORIZONTAL BEAM) OVER THE FRONT DOOR, BETWEEN THE NUMBERS OF THE CURRENT YEAR: 20 + C + M + B + 22

WHILE THE FEAST OF EPIPHANY PRIMARILY FOCUSES ON THE VISIT OF THE MAGI, HISTORICALLY IT WAS ALSO FOCUSED ON THE BAPTISM OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE JORDAN RIVER. FOR THIS REASON, THERE DEVELOPED A SPECIAL BLESSING OF EPIPHANY WATER IN MEMORY OF JESUS SANCTIFYING THE WATERS OF BAPTISM. THE EMPHASIS OF THE BLESSING WAS NOT SO MUCH ON THE COMMEMORATION OF JESUS' BAPTISM AS IT WAS ON THE SYMBOLIC NATURE OF WATER AS A PROTECTION FROM SATAN AND ALL HIS DEMONIC ANGELS. IT REMINDS US OF THE SPIRITUAL POWER OF HOLY WATER AND REMINDS US TO USE IT IN FAITH, TRUSTING IN THE PROTECTING HELP OF GOD OVER OUR SPIRITUAL ENEMIES.

The Holy Name is closely associated with the month of January as the circumcision of Jesus took place on the 8th day after His birth. That is the day He received the name Jesus, which was given to Him by the archangel Gabriel. They are a very good subject for private meditation and for family prayer.
