LET THE LIGHT OF THE GLORIOUS PAST BE TURNED ON!

(excerpts from "The First Indult Traditional Latin Mass in California" by Father Vladimir Kozina)

I am particularly excited to talk now about the circumstances of obtaining the permission for the celebration of the **INDULT TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS**.

In his Apostolic Letter on Archbishop Lefebvre's schism, *Ecclesia Dei* (July 2, 1988), the Pope expressed his desire "to guarantee respect" for the wishes of those Catholics who were attached to the Latin tradition. He asked all bishops to be "generous" in granting permission to celebrate ancient Latin Mass, according to the 1962 Roman Missal, in any parish where it was requested by 12 or more parishioners.

St. Margaret Mary's parish had the reputation of being a "traditional" parish. This was the reason why the majority of the Sunday Mass attendance in our parish were the traditional minded people who came from other parishes, not only from the city of Oakland, but even as far as Twain Harte. If it was not for these good Catholic faithful from outside of the parish, St. Margaret Mary's parish, of some 60 parishioners living within the parish boundaries, would have to be closed!

The first week of August 1989, I attended a diocesan priestly meeting at San Damiano Retreat House at Danville. On Thursday, August 3rd, I had the privilege of having breakfast with Bishop John S. Cummins. I casually asked him: "Bishop, would you give me your permission to have the Traditional Latin Mass of 1962 Missale Romanum at St. Margaret Mary's every Sunday?" "Why not? Of course, you can have it." "Really?" Thank you so much! Would you, please, make your promise in writing?" "Yes. Come to my office in 10 days. I'll have the official document ready for you."

When I returned home from Danville I told no one of the most exciting news. I wanted to see the reaction of my parishioners when they heard the good news!

I prepared a special edition of the Bulletin for Sunday, August 6, 1989. Let the joyous news utterly surprise my parishioners!

When I greeted the people after Mass in the vestibule, the majority of them did not believe me. They thought that I was kidding. But when they read the Bulletin they realized that my announcement was for real.

"Father, you did it! Because of your obedience to the Church, we finally have the Traditional Mass!"

The Bulletin for Sunday, August 6, 1989 carried the following news:

1962 LATIN MASS PERMISSION GRANTED IN OAKLAND

"His Excellency, the Most Reverend John S. Cummins, Bishop of Oakland, has granted permission for a **WEEKLY LATIN MASS** of 1962 each Sunday at 4:30 p.m. at St. Margaret Mary's. This permission was granted on Thursday, August 3rd 1989. I wish to thank Bishop Cummins for granting us the permission. I would like you to spread the **GOOD NEWS** in your localities. Speak to your friends about this permission. Invite them to the 1962 Latin Mass.

The **FIRST MASS** is scheduled for Sunday, September 10, 1989 at 4:30 p.m. at St. Margaret Mary's."

The local newspapers, including the Catholic Voice, and radio stations helped to inform readers and listeners, as well as word of mouth advertising. The good news spread around the State of California and beyond like a prairie fire. I received many telephone calls from all parts of California and the neighboring states. The callers were anxious to find out how I obtained the permission from our Bishop to have a weekly Traditional Latin Mass at St. Margaret Mary's.

Then the long awaited Sunday for the **FIRST INDULT TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS** to be celebrated in the State of California, arrived!

In the bulletin for the history making Sunday, September 10, 1989 I wrote: "1962 LATIN MASS, FIRST MASS TODAY, Sept. 10, 89, 4:30 p.m.—It is my great pleasure to welcome you, friends, who came to St. Margaret Mary's church today to attend the 4:30 p.m. Latin Mass of 1962.

As Pastor of this parish church, I would like to express my great appreciation for all you have done in helping me to have the permission of celebrating the Latin Mass of 1962 in our church every Sunday!

On this historic occasion, I wish to express my personal gratitude to our Ordinary, Bishop John S. Cummins, for having granted this permission. Thank you, Bishop Cummins!

The beautiful gothic church of St. Margaret Mary's was solemnly decorated on Sunday, September 10, 1989. At 4:30 p.m. dressed in the traditional green Mass vestments...I left the Rectory and walked to the church. Because of the crowd in the vestibule, I had to squeeze my way to reach the main aisle....there was no room in the pews.

I will never forget the great joy and many tears of happiness on the faces of the worshippers who attended the First Traditional Latin Mass at St. Margaret Mary's church. "Alleluia! Sing to the Lord a new song, let the congregation of the faithful sing His praises. For the Lord has been kind to his people, conferring victory on us who are weak, the faithful exult in triumph! (Ps 149:1-4).
