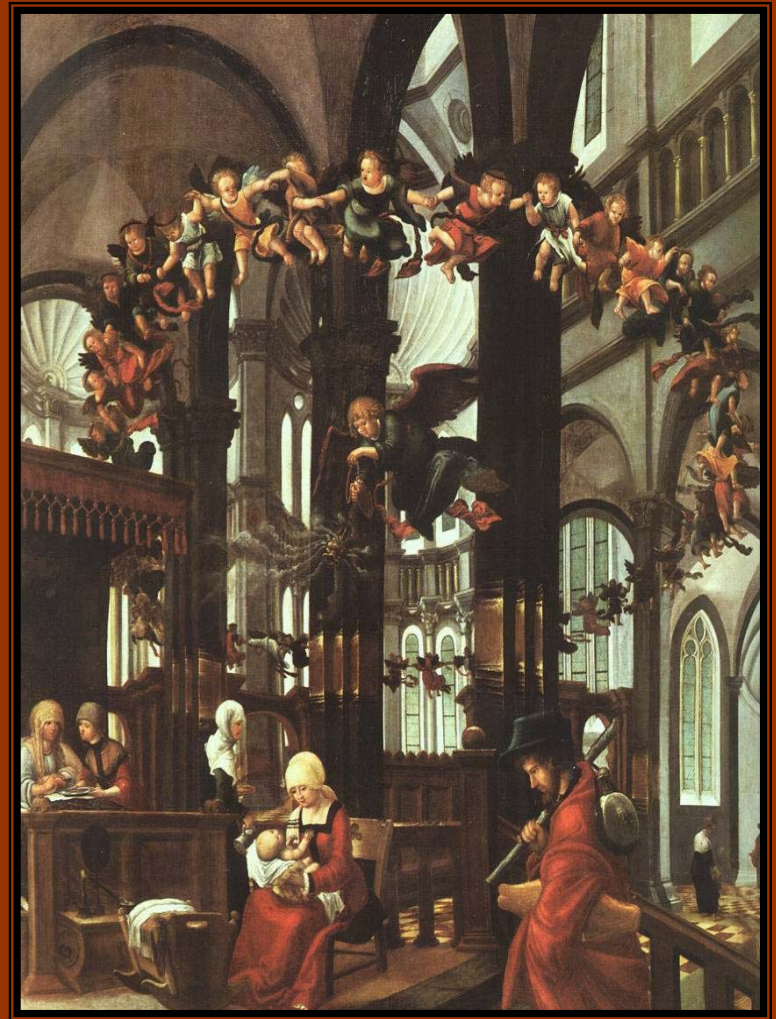

Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost

September 6, 2009

INTROIT. *Ps. 83, 10, 11.* Behold, O God, our protector, and look on the face of Thy Christ: for better is one day in Thy courts above thousands. *Ps. 83, 2, 3.* How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts! my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. *V.* Glory.

PRAYER. Guard Thy Church, we beseech Thee, O Lord, with Thy continual kindness; and, because without Thee human frailty falleth, let it, by Thine assistance, ever be both withheld from harm and guided to what is salutary. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE. *Gal. 5, 16-24.* Brethren: Walk in the spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lusts of the flesh: for the flesh lusteth against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh; for these are contrary one to another; so that you do not the things that you would. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest; which are, fornication, uncleanness, immodesty, luxury, idolatry, witchcrafts, enmities, contentions, emulations, wraths, quarrels, dissensions, sects, envies, murders, drunkenness, revelings, and such like; of the which I foretold to you, that they who do such things shall not obtain the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the spirit is, charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity. Against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified their flesh with the vices and concupiscences.

GRADUAL. *Ps. 117, 8, 9.* It is good to confide in the Lord, rather than to have confidence in man. *V.* It is good to trust in the Lord, rather than to trust in princes.

ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA. *V. Ps. 94, 1.* Come, let us praise the Lord with joy; let us joyfully sing to God our Saviour. Alleluia.

GOSPEL. *Matt. 6, 24-33.* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow, nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are not you of much more value

than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin; but I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. Now if God so clothe the grass of the field, which is to-day, and to-morrow is cast into the oven, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous therefore, saying, what shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? for after all these things do the heathen seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and His justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.

DIFFERTORY. *Ps. 33, 8, 9.* The angel of the Lord shall encamp round about them that fear Him, and shall deliver them. O taste, and see that the Lord is sweet.

SECRET. Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that this saving Victim may become both the cleansing of our sins, and the propitiation of Thy might. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION. *Matt. 6, 33.* Seek first the kingdom of God; and all things shall be added unto you, saith the Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION. May Thy Sacraments, O God, ever purify and fortify us, and bring us to the effect of everlasting salvation. Through our Lord.

YEAR OF THE PRIEST: LIFE OF SAINT JEAN-MARIE DE VIANNEY, PART V *Patron Saint of Parish Priests*



The miracles recorded by his biographers are of three classes: first, the obtaining of money for his charities and food for his orphans; secondly, supernatural knowledge of the past and future; thirdly, healing the sick, especially children. The greatest miracle of all was his life. He practiced mortification from his early youth, and for forty years his food and sleep were insufficient, humanly speaking, to sustain life. And yet he labored incessantly, with unflinching humility, gentleness, patience, and cheerfulness, until he was more than seventy-three years old.

On 3 October, 1874 Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney was proclaimed Venerable by Pius IX and on 8 January 1905, he was enrolled among the Blessed. Pope Pius X proposed him as a model to the parochial clergy.

In 1925, Pope Pius XI canonized him. His feast is traditionally kept on August 8.
