A good tree can not bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doth the will of My Father Who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

The Brown Scapular

The Brown Scapular is an outward sign of one's love and devotion to the Mother of God and an acknowledgment of her special role in His plan of salvation. It is a miniature model of the larger form worn by members of the Carmelite Order as part of their religious habit.

According to tradition, in the 13th century Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock, Superior General of the Order, and gave him the brown scapular saying that whoever wore it would be preserved from eternal damnation and on the 1st Saturday after their death, would be taken by Her to heaven.

The wearing of the scapular must be understood to mean that one is striving earnestly to live up to all Christian ideals. It does not take the place of the Church's sacraments, but is an outward sign of inward commitment to virtue and Christian piety, under the patronage of Mary.

The Church teaches us to believe that those who hold an intimate and faithful devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary will be particularly blessed by her. Thus the wearing of Her Brown Scapular signifies a pledge on our part and a promise on Hers. Placing us under her protection, it becomes an aid throughout life to help us maintain the virtues of our vocations. As an outward profession of dedication and trust in Mary, it necessarily calls down special grace, for She would share the sentiments of Her Son who said; "If anyone openly declared himself for Me in the presence of men, the Son of Man will declare Himself for him in the presence of God's angels." (Luke 12:8)
