

Luke 18, 31-43

QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

FEBRUARY 11, 2018

Introit. Ps. 30, 3, 4. Be thou unto me a God, a protector, and a place of refuge, to save me: for Thou art my strength, and my refuge; and for Thy name's sake Thou wilt be my leader, and wilt nourish me. Ps. 30, 2. In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and set me free.

Collect. Of Thy clemency harken unto our prayers, O Lord, loose us from the bonds of sin, and keep us from all adversity. Through our Lord.

Epistle. 1 Cor. 13, 1-13. Brethren, if I speak with the tongues of men, and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I should have prophecy, and know all mysteries, and all knowledge, and if I should have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity; I am nothing. And if I should distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I should deliver my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind: charity envieth not; dealeth not perversely; is not puffed up; is not ambitious; seeketh not her own; is not provoked to anger; thinketh no evil; rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never falleth away: whether prophecies shall be made void, or tongues shall cease or knowledge shall be destroyed. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away the things of a child. We see now through a glass in a dark manner; but then face to face. Now I know in part; but then I shall know even as I am known. And now there remain, faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

Gradual. Ps. 76, 15, 16. Thou art the God that alone dost wonders: Thou hast made Thy power known among the nations. V. With Thy arm Thou hast redeemed Thy people, the children of Israel and of Joseph.

Tract. Ps. 99, 1, 2. Sing joyfully to God all the earth: serve ye the Lord with gladness. V. Come in before His presence with exceeding great joy: know ye that the Lord He is God. V. He made us, and not we ourselves: but we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture.

Gospel. Luke 18, 31-43. At that time, Jesus took unto Him the twelve, and said to them, Behold we go up to Jerusalem, and all things shall be accomplished which were written by the prophets concerning the Son of man: for He shall be delivered to the gentiles, and shall be mocked, and scourged, and spit upon; and after they have scourged Him, they will put Him to death; and the third day He shall rise again. And they understood none of these things, and this word was hid from them, and they understood not the things that were said. Now it came to pass, when He drew nigh to Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the wayside, begging. And when he heard the multitude passing by, he asked what this meant. And they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me. And they that went before, rebuked him, that he should hold his peace: but he cried out much more, Son of David, have mercy on me. And Jesus standing, commanded him to be brought unto Him: and when he was come near, He asked him, saying, What wilt thou that I do to

thee? But he said, Lord, that I may see. And Jesus said to him, Receive thy sight: thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he saw, and followed Him, glorifying God: and all the people when they saw it, gave praise to God.

Offertory. Ps. 118, 12, 13. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, teach me Thy justifications: with my lips I have pronounced all the judgments of Thy mouth.

Secret. May this offering, we beseech Thee, O Lord, cleanse away our sins, sanctify us in soul and body, and fit us, Thy servants, for the celebration of the sacrifice. Through our Lord.

Communion. Ps. 77, 29, 30. They did eat, and were filled exceedingly, and the Lord gave them their desire: they were not defrauded of that which they craved.

Postcommunion. We beseech Thee, O almighty God, that we, who have partaken of heavenly nourishment, may be fortified by it against all adversities. Through our Lord.

WELCOME TO ST. MARY ORATORY

With the gracious permission of Bishop David Malloy, Bishop of Rockford, the extraordinary form of Holy Mass is offered at St. Mary by the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*. We are pleased to have you join us in this venerable act of worship and invite you to return often.

In the traditional Mass everyone has his proper role whether it be celebrant, choir, server, usher, or congregation. At High Mass, the choir makes all responses simply because that is their function. The congregation, on the other hand, responds internally, as opposed to vocally, and this is still, according to Pope Pius XII in his encyclical "Mediator Dei" active participation. Active participation is wide-ranging, such as singing, silent meditation or even recitation of the Rosary during Mass, because active participation does not necessitate vocal responses but unity of intent with the celebrant (priest). To assist at Mass more fully, use the missals provided in the pews, paying particular attention to any notes in the margin. All the "propers," scriptural parts of the Mass, proper to the day. These can be found in the bulletin. Simply follow those around you as to when one should stand, sit, or kneel. Lastly, please keep a "holy silence" in the church at all times, out of respect for Christ's presence in the tabernacle. Since there is no mixing of the old and new rites, Holy Communion is to be received on the tongue while kneeling at the altar rail. the response "Amen" is not said by the communicant when receiving the Host.

We would like to invite any member of the parish to a new apostolate specifically to pray for the conversion of children, relatives or friends who have left the church under the mantle of Our Lady Auxilium Christianorum (Mary Help of Christians). The first meeting will take place the second Saturday of the month after the 8 AM Mass in the church. If you would like more information please call Sandra Dettori at (815)793-2661.
