#### From the Chaplain's Desk

#### Catechism Resources I



As we begin our series on the Catechism, it would, perhaps, be well to provide a brief description of some of the reliable catechetical materials available. This week, we will present some of the more basic materials which are suitable for both children and adults. Even though some of these materials are intended for children, they are also useful for adults who are in need of a brief refresher course as well as those who can find solace in a return to the Faith as they first encountered it. Although this is cer-

tainly not an exhaustive list, it is hoped that these materials will be found useful to those who desire to grow in knowing and loving the Catholic Faith.

The Baltimore Catechism St. Joseph Edition numbers 1 and 2 are readily available from online retailers and are carried in some Catholic bookstores as well. These books are extremely valuable in that they include illustrations and examples which can be applied to daily life. Even though they are used primarily in the instruction of children, they are useful to adults as well, particularly No. 2. The Baltimore Catechism No. 3 is also available in book form from online sources as well as in a cost-free format, also to be found online. It lacks the illustrations of the St. Joseph editions, but it has many helpful examples and explanations.

One of the best resources for catechetical instruction is My Catholic Faith, published by Sarto House, available from various online retailers. Also readily available are Trese's The Faith Explained and Martin's The Catholic Religion.
