**MSGR. RONALD KNOX ON "THE MASS"...**

The sacrifice of the Mass is a mystery and perhaps its relation to the sacrifice on the cross is the most mysterious thing about it. Only this is certain, that the victim who is there presented to the Father for our sakes is the dying Christ; it is in that posture that He pleaded, and pleads for our salvation, atoned and atones, for the sins of the world. We herald that death in the Holy Mass, not as something which happened long ago, but as something which is mystically renewed whenever the words of consecration are uttered. From the moment of his death on Calvary until the time when he comes again in glory, the dying Christ is continually at work, is continually available. It is in this posture of death that he pleads for us, when the Mass is offered.

"When I saw in Catherine of Siena's life so many raptures and elevations of spirit, words of wisdom and even sermons uttered by her, I did not doubt that by the eye of contemplation she had ravished the heart of her heavenly Spouse. But I was equally comforted when I saw her in her father's kitchen, humbly turning the spit, kindling fires, dressing meat, kneading bread, and doing the meanest household chores cheerfully and filled with love and affection for God. I do not have less esteem for the humble little meditations she made during these mean, lowly tasks than for the ecstasies and raptures she so often had. Perhaps they were granted to her only in recompense for her humility and self-abasement...

"Great opportunities to serve God rarely present themselves but little ones are frequent. Whoever will be "faithful over a few things" will be placed "over many" says the Savior. Provided you know how to fulfill your duties properly, then "whether you eat or drink," whether you sleep or take recreation or turn the spit, you will profit greatly in God's sight by doing all these things because God wishes you to do them."

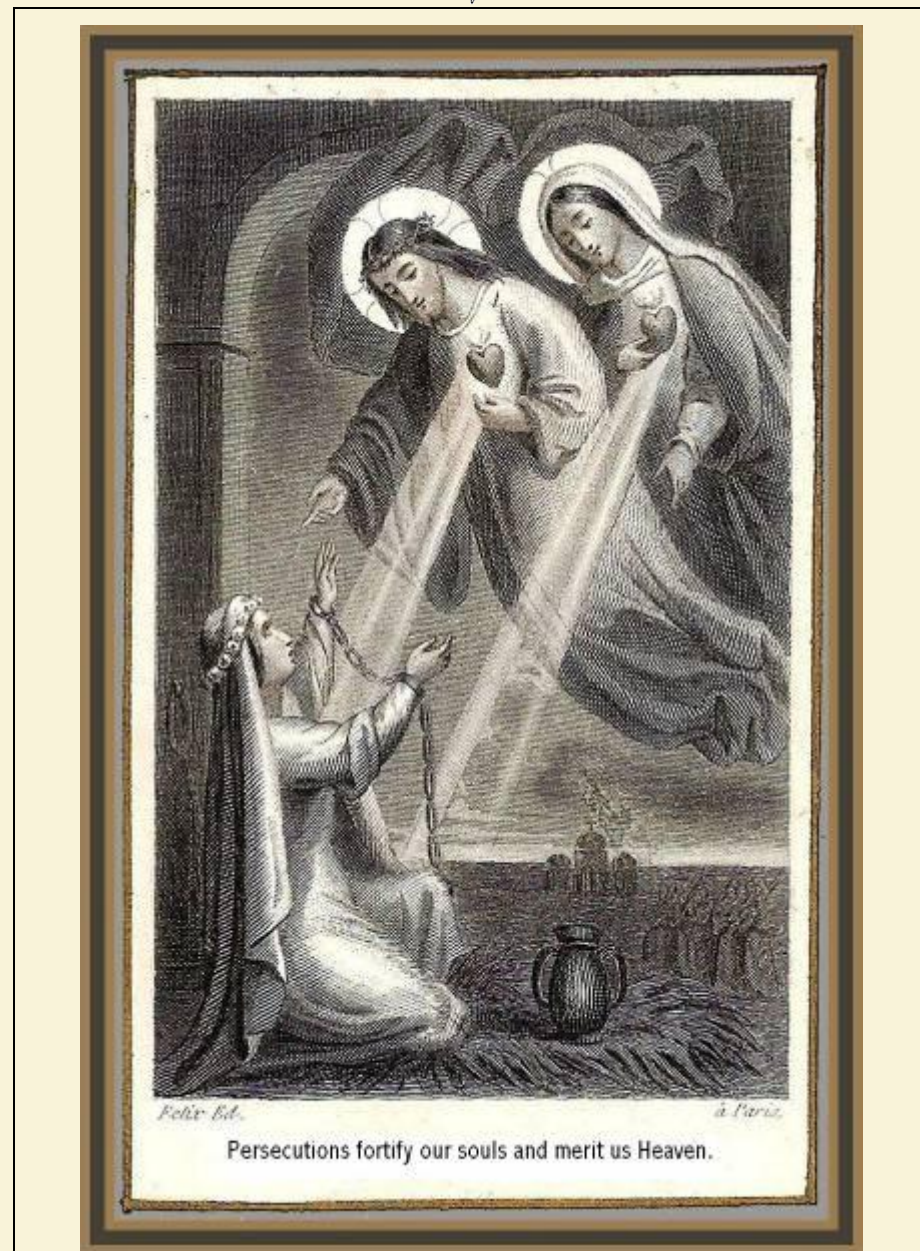
### MSGR. WACH TO VISIT ROME
