At this time of year nature begins her long sleep of Winter, awaiting its resurrection next Spring. How appropriate this Feast now with its message of detachment from material things before ascending to the riches of an Eternal Spring. The **Epistle** lifts the veil, beholding *"a great multitude which no man could number"* entering Heaven. Oh, the comforting thought that it is a great multitude!

This view and foretaste of Heaven calls for work to be done on earth. The **Gospel**, therefore, sets forth the laws of entrance, the Eight Beatitudes, which make us *"blessed,"* that is *"happy"* clearly proving that the Christian Life is not a *"giving up"* of present things but rather an *"exchange"* of natural for supernatural things designed to merge sooner or later with those blessings of beatific vision and beatific union, eternal, without end.

Help us, St. Joseph, in our daily strife, ever to lead a pure and blameless life.

Communion of Saints: The Church is divided in the following manner: The Church in Heaven, All Saints. The Church in purgatory, All Souls. The Church on earth, All Sorts. (Msgr. Ronald Knox)

Fr. Ottonello has said for years that many Catholics fail to regard the teachings of the Church as truly serious in their lives. One indication is failure of many Catholics to go beyond the obligation of Sunday Mass. Some never attend the Mass of a Holy Day unless it falls on a Sunday. By moving important Holy Days to Sunday the impression is given that they are unimportant and may be disregarded unless one falls on Sunday. Many faithful never attend a weekday Mass to make reparation to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. There are many weighty reasons: Long hours at work, family obligations among others. But, God gives each of us only so much time to work out our destiny on earth. If we misspend our time, reject or disregard Graces sent by God, we may likely end up in either Purgatory or Hell. If Grace is rejected over and over, God will withhold it until we request it. Perhaps too late!

All Souls Day: Each priest is free to say 3 Masses of the Dead on Monday, 2 NOV. A stipend may be accepted for only one Mass of the day by priests, and the second and third Masses must be offered for the Poor Souls in Purgatory and Intentions of the Holy Father respectively. All Souls was formerly a Holy Day which was downgraded to a 1 cl. feast day. Yet, one puts his spiritual welfare in jeopardy by not praying at Mass for those who have gone before that they may be released from the pains of Purgatory, identical in suffering to the pains of hell, though not eternal in duration. The Holy Souls have hope and confidence of entering into the Beatific Vision when they are cleansed of sin. Think of the importance of venial sin to God which makes one impure and unable to go immediately into Heaven. Some Souls will suffer until the end of time. Vespers of the Dead may be said where it is the custom. A **Plenary Indulgence** may be gained on All Souls Day, under the usual conditions of Sacrament of Penance and prayers for intentions of the Holy Father, for intention of a Holy Soul.

Monday: All Souls Day. Mass at 6:30 p.m. Envelopes for your offerings are in back of the church on which to place the names of your deceased. The

envelopes will remain on the altar the entire month of November and your beloved will be remembered in all Masses of the month.

Tuesday: Mass of St. Hubertus: Confessor. The 8th Century Saint is one of the Four Holy Marshals, patron of hunters, archers and dogs, invoked for protection against rabies, plague and other diseases—perhaps these days the Swine Flu. Bread is blessed in his honor on this day for the faithful to take home. Ask the holy Saint to protect our families from the pandemic. St. Hubert was a libertine and nobleman who enjoyed hunting. One day, on Good Friday, he was hunting and chased a stag who turned with a crucifix between its antlers. A voice told Hubert to change his ways or he would be condemned to hell. Changing his life, he studied for the priesthood upon the death of his wife and was consecrated Bishop of Maas-tricht, Netherlands. Later, he became first Bishop of Liege, France. Bread will be blessed in his honor for distribution to the faithful.
