

SUNDAY MASS SIGN UP

Public Masses resumed on May 18th and practically speaking, our weekly public Mass, Confession and Adoration schedule will continue as it was before the suspension of public Masses. You may consult the weekly bulletin for these times.

With this reopening comes gathering size restrictions. This will mainly affect the Sunday Mass schedule, as we can permit no more than 240 people in the Oratory at one time according to the restrictions in order to best maintain distancing requirements. This will require additional Sunday Masses. These additional Mass times are TEMPORARY until we are really “back to normal.” The new temporary Sunday times are 7:30am, 9:00am, 10:30am and 1:00pm. My prayer is that “normal” will come sooner rather than later, so please be alert for adjustments and changes to the schedule during the coming weeks.

I request that you sign you and your family up for these Masses by way of Signup Genius. Each Monday a schedule will be put out by way of email, the SFdS website and social media for the following Sunday liturgies. This will be necessary each Sunday until larger groups are permitted. I apologize if your preferred time slot is not available every week; thank you in advance for being as flexible as possible. Those without access to social media or email may call the Oratory office in order to be entered into the Mass of their choice.

For those who are older or who have well-founded fear for their health, you should in no way feel under any pressure to attend Mass at this time (provided, of course, that you do your best to sanctify the Lord’s Day religiously at home). Those who have flu symptoms or who have reason to believe they have been exposed to the virus should NOT come to church at this time, as an act of charity to others.

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE HOLY HOUR

Jesus appeared in 1674 to a humble nun, Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque while she was in prayer. It was not the first time that Christ manifested himself by showing her his Heart.

On that occasion, Jesus asked for the "Holy Hour" of reparation. It is an hour that would be dedicated to becoming a participant in the sorrows of Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane.

The propagation of this pious practice in the Catholic world is closely linked to the cult of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The Holy Hour has three main characteristics that are included in the memoirs of Saint Margaret Mary: prayer of reparation, union with the suffering Jesus in Gethsemane and acts of humiliation.

Its purpose, therefore, is spending an hour meditating on the mystery of Christ when He felt lonely and weak, like us, and asked the Father to remove the cup of his Passion.

It is an hour to accompany him, present in the Most Blessed Sacrament, as did the Angel in the garden of Gethsemane.

It is an hour to repair with our prayers all the outrages, irreverence and sacrileges that He receives in the Sacrament of His Love.

Also the Holy hour is a moment that each one has to be alone with Our Lord.

Bishop Fulton Sheen - man of God, writer, first Catholic radio preacher and archbishop - never attributed his success to himself, but to Our Lord Jesus Christ, with whom he met daily in the Most Blessed Sacrament when he made a Holy Hour! Fulton J. Sheen called this hour "the Hour of Power".

Dear Friends, let us commit ourselves with determination to make a Holy Hour that will serve to manifest our Love for Our Lord Jesus Christ presents in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar and that will also serve to repair His Divine Majesty offended by the unfaithfuls and by many Catholics throughout the world.

This will be our Hour of Power!

If we are faithful to the Holy Hour, we will grow in friendship of Christ, we will grow in holiness and peace will increase in our souls. We will work with order and discipline, and we will be a source of sanctification and conversion for others, we will receive Jesus with greater purity of heart in Holy Communion and we will be a jewel in the crown of Mary, from whose hand we will contemplate the Greatness of the Trinity for all eternity.


Couples planning to marry at the Oratory must call the rectory for the proper instructions.
