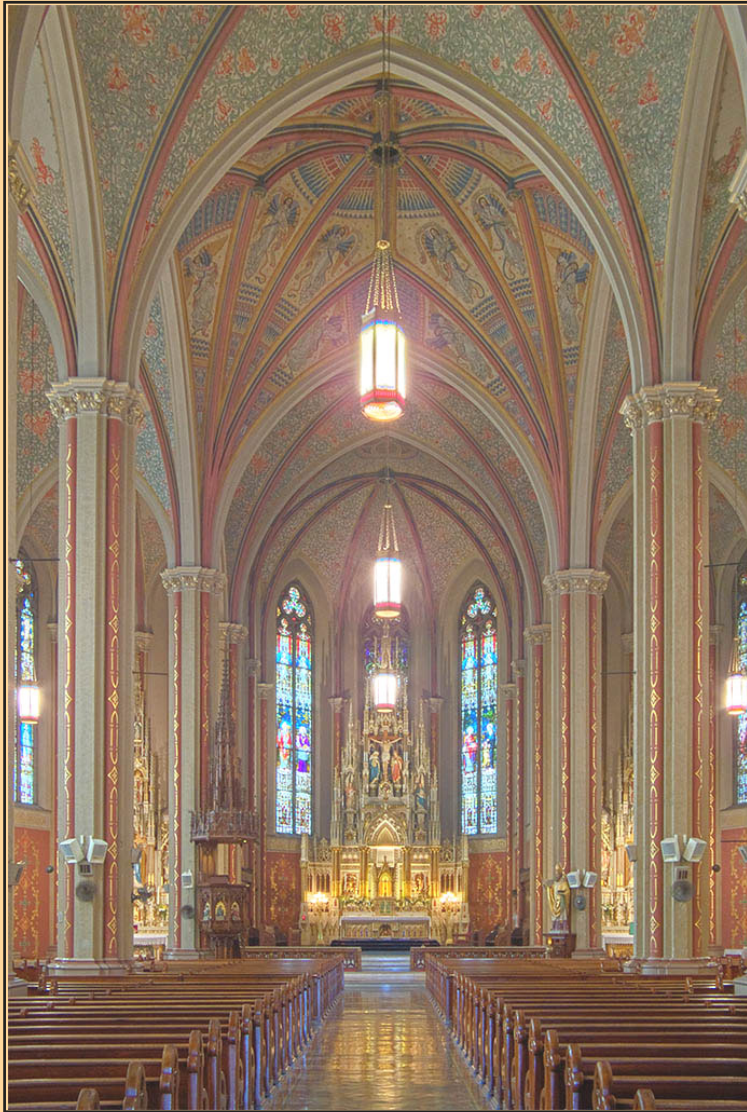

The whole of creation is sanctified by the redemption of Christ. This re-creation happened by employing Christ's sacred humanity, but also by including instruments of the Passion which are holy instruments to achieve our salvation.

MY DEAR FAITHFUL AND FRIENDS AT ST. FRANCIS DE SALES ORATORY,

Dear Faithful,

Lent has begun. During the month of March, we have the opportunity to seek the intercessions of our patrons whose feasts we celebrate this month, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Benedict, and also St. Joseph the patron of the Universal Church, to help us unite ourselves more closely to Our Lord. Let us be reminded that the end of practicing virtues and avoiding sins is not self-improvement, but union with His Most Sacred Heart.

From March 28 through 31, the Oratory will have the pleasure of hosting a retreat for all Institute priests serving in the US Province. Monsignor Gilles Wach, the Institute's founder and Prior General, will come to St. Louis for this purpose. On Sunday, March 27, Msgr. Wach will be the celebrant at the 10 AM Mass, and Canon Michael Stein (presently in Gabon, Africa), will be the homilist, preaching on Greed as part of our scheduled sermons on the Deadly Sins. After the reception in the hall for Monsignor Wach, Canon Stein will give a talk about the missions of the Institute in Africa.

The closing Mass of the priestly retreat will take place on Thursday, March 31, at 6:30 PM, with Msgr. Wach as the celebrant of the Solemn High Mass. All are invited.

Please also mark on your calendars for Saturday, April 9, 11 AM, when we will have a special invited speaker, Monsignor Arthur Calkins, currently the chaplain of the Carmelite Sisters of the Divine Heart of Jesus. Monsignor Calkins has written extensively on the Blessed Virgin Mary, and his presentation on her role as the Redeemer's most intimate collaborator in the work of our salvation and sanctification will be most edifying.

MARIAN COREDEMPTION AND MEDIATION:

AN INTRODUCTION

In the course of two millennia and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit the Catholic Church has come to an ever more focused understanding of the person and role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. The first Marian dogma to be solemnly declared was that Mary is in fact the *Theotókos*, the God-bearer or Mother of God. Subsequently the Church reached the certitude that Mary is ever Virgin: that she was a virgin before, during and after giving birth to Jesus. After centuries of debate the Catholic Church arrived at the assurance that Mary was immaculate from the first moment of her conception. Finally in 1950, after ascertaining the Church's long held belief, the Venerable Pius XII formally defined that the Virgin Mary was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven.

All four of these dogmas refer to the person of Mary in relation to the God-man, Jesus Christ. But Catholics believe even more about Mary than these profound mysteries regarding her person. They also believe that she played and continues to play an entirely unique role in the work of our salvation. In the course of the second millennium saints and theologians have been meditating, preaching and writing about Mary's collaboration in the work of redemption and in the distribution of grace while for over one hundred fifty years the Popes have teaching about her maternal role. On Saturday, 9 April 2011, Monsignor Arthur B. Calkins, chaplain of the Carmelite Sisters of the Divine Heart of Jesus, will present an introduction to the Virgin Mary's role as the Redeemer's most intimate collaborator in the work of our salvation and sanctification.
