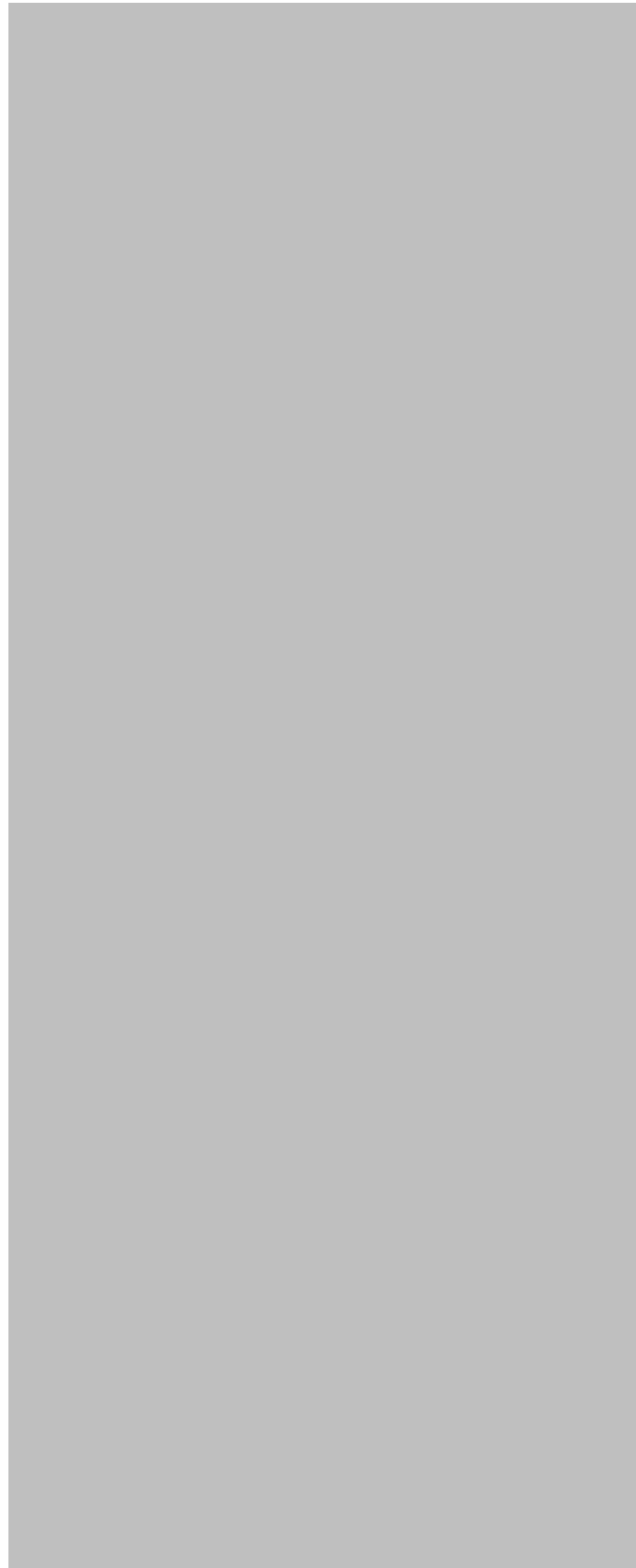

HOMESCHOOL CO-OP NEWS...

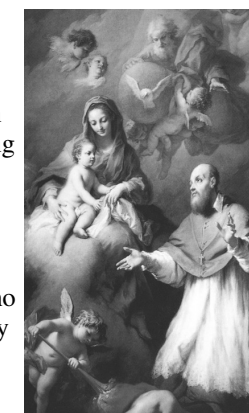
