FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

MY DEAR FAITHFUL AND FRIENDS AT ST. FRANCIS DE SALES ORATORY,

The exterior of the church building has been the focus of our constructive attention in the last few months. The north and south stairways into church have been tuck pointed and re-caulked and the banisters strengthened. The iron stairs which lead from the courtyard to the sacristy are being repaired, and more repairs and painting will be necessary. This original structure is over 100 years old, and is beautiful and strong, but it needs maintenance.

A new fence which covers the walkway between the rectory and the convent is being erected so as to give the sisters security and protected passage to the rectory.

Entrance stairs to the convent and its supporting stone walls are being re-built. The St. Joseph garden on the south side of the campus has been totally refurbished, thanks to the dedicated work of the Miller family. The lovely garden beautifies the exterior of the church, and extends a green contemplative space from the church.

Installing a new sign at the main entrance of the church has proved to involve far more administrative paperwork than physical work. The permit-seeking process through the city's Preservation Board is progressing very well, thanks to the generous pro bono work of a local law firm. However, many prayers are needed to overcome more obstacles to the final installation.

The tower illumination project is another major work which is close to completion. The old light poles will be taken down as one of the final steps when the new lighting system will be completed.

All the work which has been accomplished has been possible only through *your* generous donations and prayers and they are a sign of our commitment to one another and to the community.

For all your continuous and faithful support, the Oratory with its staff and the whole Institute is immensely grateful.

ST. FRANCIS DE SALES WELCOMES KIPP TO ST. LOUIS

The St. Francis de Sales Oratory has been very pleased with the presence of the well-respected KIPP charter school on its campus. KIPP Inspire Academy, the first KIPP school in St. Louis and the only school sponsored by Washington University, currently leases the former high school building with its main entrance on Ohio Avenue.

According to Jeremy Esposito, leader and founder, KIPP Inspire Academy opened in 2009 with 75 students and will add one grade per year. It is now enrolling students who will be in the 5th and 6th grades next year. In the 2010-2011 academic year, KIPP Inspire expects to double its growth to 150 students, all from the St. Louis area. KIPP Inspire Academy is the first St. Louis school to be a part of the Knowledge is Power Program, a national network of free, open-enrollment, college-preparatory public schools; the network has a track record of preparing students in underserved communities for success in college and in life.

Currently there are 82 KIPP schools serving over 21,000 students in 19 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty percent of KIPP students are low-income and 90 percent are African American or Latino. By forging close relationships among students, parents and staff, KIPP makes sure each of its students is able to climb the mountain to college.

As a strong supporter of education, the Oratory rejoices with KIPP Inspire Academy on completing its first year in St. Louis. Already test results show significant improvements in academic achievements of many KIPP students.
