


Diocesan Schools Collection

St. Francis de Sales *thoughts for meditation:*



Uneasiness arises from an inordinate desire to be freed of some evil or from the suffering we are undergoing; or it results from the desire for some benefit we want too eagerly. In either case, anxiety only aggravates the situation. So when you are seized by some desire to be freed from an evil or to acquire something you think is good, in the very first place put yourself in a calm and tranquil mood; tone down your judgment and your will, and then with gentleness quietly await the outcome of your desires. (INT. Part I, Ch. 11)



Sanctification of Priests

“Dearly beloved sons, chosen by the judgment of our brethren to be our helpers in the ministry, maintain

in your deportment inviolate purity and holiness of life. Understand what you do, imitate what you administer. Inasmuch as you celebrate the mystery of the death of the Lord, you should endeavor to mortify in your members all sin and concupiscence. Let your teaching be a spiritual medicine for the people of God and the odor of your lives a delight for the Church of Christ. May you thus build up, by preaching and example, the house, that is, the family of God, so that your promotion may not be a cause of damnation for me, nor the reception of so great an office for you, but rather of reward. May He by His grace grant it to us. Amen.” —*Roman Pontifical, Ordination of Priests.*

These words that the ordaining bishop addresses to the men soon to be ordained to the sacred priesthood emphasizes the holiness of life which a priest must live. All the baptized faithful are called to holiness, to become saints in virtue of their being delivered from original sin and made children of God. The priest however has an additional obligation towards holiness because of the sacred character imprinted on his soul at ordination; the character which makes him capable of offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass and forgiving sins. The ordained becomes an extension of the Priesthood of Christ and a channel of divine and sanctifying grace. His constant and intimate contact with the Sacred demands that he be holy.

The priest faces the same spiritual enemies as do all the faithful: the devil, the flesh, and the world. The devil knows rightly that a holy priest takes a thousand souls with him to heaven, and that a wicked priest a thousand souls with him to hell. And so his attacks on the priest are much more than the ordinary faithful. Our holy Mother, the Church, has readily understood this and has since time immemorial imposed a special discipline upon the clergy: Prayers (Mass, Divine Office, Rosary, Meditation...); Spiritual Direction, Confession, Retreats; Conduct (clerical attire, interactions with others, &c.). This discipline is meant for fostering of a holy life, and to preserve the priestly identity which is necessary for perseverance.

The Church also exhorts the faithful to pray for priests. Special times have been set aside for this purpose. There are the Emberdays (days of prayer and fasting for the sanctification of the clergy). The Emberdays are the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday following the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14th), the 3rd Sunday of Advent, 1st Sunday of Lent, and Pentecost Sunday. There is also the devotion of the First Thursdays of the month. Of course one can pray for priests at anytime.

Prayer for Priests

O Almighty and Eternal God, look upon the Face of Thy Christ, and for love of Him Who is the eternal High-priest, have pity on Thy priests. Remember, O most compassionate God, that they are but weak and frail human beings. Stir up in them the grace of their vocation which is in them by the imposition of the Bishop's hands. Keep them close to Thee, lest the enemy prevail against them, so that they may never do anything in the slightest degree unworthy of their sublime vocation.

O Jesus, I pray Thee for Thy faithful and fervent priests; for Thy unfaithful and tepid priests; for Thy priests laboring at home or abroad in distant mission fields; for Thy tempted priests; for Thy lonely and desolate priests; for Thy young priests; for Thy aged priests; for Thy sick priests; for Thy dying priests; for the souls of Thy priests in Purgatory.

But above all I commend to Thee the priests dearest to me: the priest who baptized me; the priests at whose Masses I assisted and who gave me Thy Body and Blood in Holy Communion; the priests who taught and instructed or helped me and encouraged me; all the priests to whom I am indebted in any other way, particularly (*name(s) of priest(s) here*). O Jesus, keep them all close to Thy heart, and bless them abundantly in time and in eternity. Amen. Mary, Queen of the clergy, pray for us; obtain for us many and holy priests. Amen.



Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ps. 118: 137, 124*, Thou art just, O Lord, and Thy judgment is right; deal with Thy servant according to Thy mercy. *Ps. 118: 1* Blessed are the undefiled in the way: who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be. Thou art just, O Lord...

COLLECT: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that Thy people may shun all the wiles of the devil: and with pure mind follow Thee, the only God. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *Eph. 4: 1-6* Brethren: I, a prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that you walk worthy of the vocation in which you are called. With all humility and mildness, with patience, supporting one another in charity, careful to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. One body and one spirit, as you are called in one hope of your calling. One Lord, one faith, one baptism. One God and Father of all, Who is above all, and through all, and in us all; Who is blessed for ever and ever. Amen.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 32: 12, 16* Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord: the people whom He hath chosen for His inheritance. By the word of the Lord the heavens were established, and all the power of them by the spirit of His mouth.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 97: 1* Alleluia, alleluia. O Lord, hear my prayer; and let my cry come to Thee. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 22: 34-46* At that time the Pharisees came to Jesus, and one of them, a doctor of the law, asked Him, tempting Him: Master, which is the great commandment of the law? Jesus said to him: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like to this: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments dependeth the whole law and the Prophets.

And the Pharisees being gathered together, Jesus asked them saying: What think you of Christ? Whose son is He? They say to Him: David's. He saith to them: How then doth David in spirit call Him Lord, saying: The Lord said to my Lord: Sit on My right hand, until I make Thine enemies Thy footstool? If David then call Him Lord, how is He his son? And no man was able to answer Him a word; neither durst any man from that day forth ask Him any more questions.


