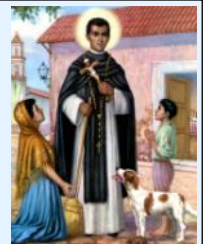

St. Michael the Archangel

Michaelmas
(September 29th)

The glorious Archangel Michael appears today at the head of the heavenly army— “There was a great battle in Heaven: Michael and his angels fought with the dragon, and the dragon fought with

his angels” (*Apoc. 12: 7*). This festival has been kept with great solemnity on the 29th of September ever since the fifth century, and was certainly celebrated in Apulia in 493, especially after the Apparition of St. Michael on Mount Gargano and the subsequent dedication of the Church of St. Michael built there in honor of this great Archangel. This dedication gave occasion to the institution of this Feast in the West, which is hence called in the Martyrologies of St. Jerome, the Venerable Bede, and others, “The Dedication of St. Michael.” The dedication of St. Michael’s Church in Rome, upon Adrian’s Mole by Pope Boniface IV in 610, and that of several other churches in the West in honor of this Archangel, which were performed on this same day, increased the celebrity of this day, which had, however, been long before consecrated by Rome to the memory of all the heavenly Powers.

Origin of the Prayer to Saint Michael

One day, after celebrating Mass, the aged Pope Leo XIII was in conference with the Cardinals when suddenly he sank to the floor in a deep swoon. Physicians who hastened to his side could find no trace of his pulse and feared that he had expired. However, after a short interval the Holy Father regained consciousness and exclaimed with great emotion: “Oh, what a horrible picture I have been permitted to see!”

He had been shown a vision of evil spirits who had been released from hell and their efforts to destroy the Church. But in the midst of the horror the archangel St. Michael appeared and cast Satan and his legions into the abyss of hell. Soon afterwards Pope Leo XIII composed a prayer to St. Michael,

imploping his protection for the Church. We do well to pray it often.

The Prayer

St. Michael, the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and the other evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen

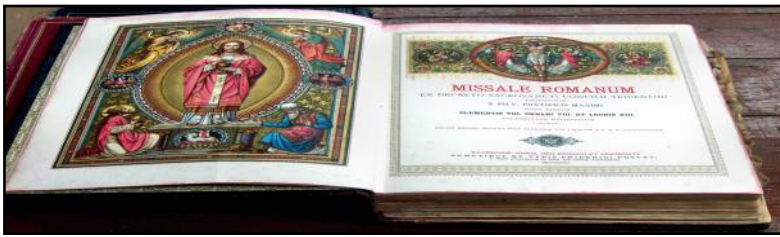

Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ecclus. 36: 18* Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel. *Ps. 121: 1* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be. Give peace, O Lord...

COLLECT: Let the exercise of Thy compassion, we beseech Thee, O Lord, direct our hearts: for without Thee we are not able to please Thee. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *I Cor. 1: 4-8* Brethren, I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Jesus Christ, that in all things you are made rich in Him in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you; so that nothing is wanting to you in any grace, waiting for the manifestation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Who also will confirm you unto the end without crime, in the day of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 121: 1, 7* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of our Lord. Let peace be in thy strength, and abundance in thy towers.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 101: 16* Alleluia, alleluia. The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 9: 1-8* At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said:

Why do you think evil in your hearts? whether is easier to say: Thy sins are forgiven thee, or to say: Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy): Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose, and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it feared and glorified God Who had given such power to men.

OFFERTORY: *Ex. 24: 4, 5* Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

SECRET: O God, Who, by Thy venerable intercourse with us in this Sacrifice dost make us partakers of the one Supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may follow it by worthy lives. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: *Ps. 95: 8-9* Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

POSTCOMMUNION: We have been renewed, O Lord, by Thy sacred Gift, and thank Thee, beseeching Thee in Thy mercy to make us worthy partakers in It. Through our Lord...
