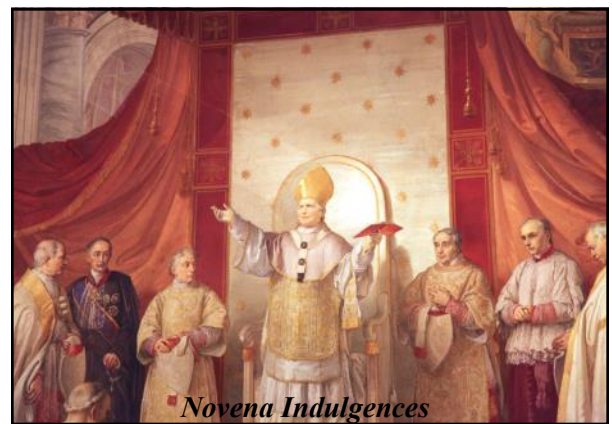

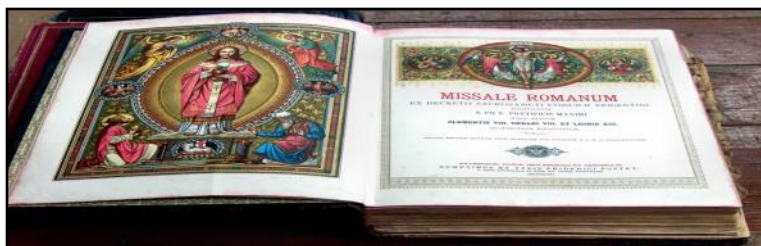
## Novena Prayer to the Immaculate Conception

**Novena Indulgences**

*All the faithful who participate in the novena devotions may gain a partial indulgence. The "amount" of the partial indulgence is proportionate to the dispositions for the one who gains the indulgence. To gain a partial indulgence, a member of the faithful must be in the state of grace, do the work wherein the indulgence is attached, and have the intention of gaining the indulgence.*



*1st Sunday of Advent*

**INTROIT:** (Ps. 24. 1-3; *Ibid.* 4) To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. Ps. Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

**COLLECT:** Arise in Thy strength, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: from the dangers which threaten us because of our sins, be Thy presence our sure defense, be Thy deliverance our safety for evermore. Who livest and reignest, with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

**Epistle:** (Rom 13. 11-14) A reading from the Epistle of the blessed apostle Paul to the Romans. Brethren, knowing the time, that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is past, and the day is at hand; let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy; but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

**GRADUAL:** (Ps. 24. 3, 4) None of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths.

**ALLELUIA:** (Ps. 84. 8) Alleluia, alleluia. Show us O Lord, Thy mercy: and grant us Thy salvation. Alleluia.

**Gospel:** (Luke 21. 25-33) Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "There shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, by reason of the confusion of the roaring of the sea and of the waves: men withering away for fear and expectation of what shall come upon the whole world. For the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud

with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand." And He spoke to them a similitude: "See the fig tree, and all the trees; when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh; so you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen I say to you, this generation shall not pass away till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away."

**OFFERTORY:** (Ps. 24. 1-3) To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait for Thee shall be confounded.

**SECRET:** May, O Lord, these Sacred Rites enable us, whom by Thy mighty power Thou hast cleansed from sin, to come pure in heart before Thee who art their author. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

**COMMUNION:** (Ps. 84. 13) The Lord will give goodness: and our earth shall yield her fruit.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** May we in the midst of Thy holy temple, O Lord, receive of Thy mercy, who seek with fitting honour to welcome the coming festival of our Redemption. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

### *Collect*

O God, Who, by the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin, didst prepare a worthy dwelling for Thy Son, we beseech Thee that Thou, Who, by the death, foreseen by Thee, of the same Thy Son, didst preserve her from all stain, wilt grant us also, by her intercession, to come to Thee pure in heart. Through the same Jesus Christ....

### *Epistle—Proverbs 8:22-35*

A reading from the Book of Wisdom. The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived, neither had the fountains of waters as yet sprung out. The mountains with their huge bulk had not as yet been established, before the hills I was brought forth. He had not as yet made the earth, nor the rivers, nor the poles of the world. When He prepared the heavens I was present, when with a certain law and compass He enclosed the depths; when He established the sky above, and poised the fountains of waters; When He compassed the sea with its bounds, and set a law to the waters that they should not pass their limits; When He balanced the foundations of the earth I was with him forming all things. And I was delighted every day, playing before Him at all times; Playing in the world, and my delights were to be with the children of men.

Now, therefore, children, hear me: blessed are they who keep my ways. Hear instruction and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man who hears me, and who watches daily at my gates, and waits at the posts of my doors. He who shall find me shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

### *Gradual—Judith 13:23; 15:10*

Blessed art thou, O Virgin Mary, by the Lord, the most high God, above all women, upon the earth. *℟̄.* Thou art the glory of Jerusalem, thou art the joy of Israel, thou art the honor of our people.

### *Alleluia—Canticle of Canticles 4:7*

Alleluia, alleluia. *℟̄.* Thou art all fair, O Mary, and there is in thee no stain of original sin. Alleluia.

### *Gospel—Luke 1:26-28*

At that time: The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David: and the virgin's name was Mary. And when the angel had come to her, he said: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women.

### *Offertory—Luke 1:28*

Hail, Mary, full of grace: the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. Alleluia.

### *Secret*

Receive, O Lord, the saving oblation which we offer Thee on the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and grant that, as we confess her to have been preserved, by Thy prevenient grace, from all taint of evil, so, through her intercession, we may be freed from all sin. Through our Lord...

### *Communion*

Glorious things are spoken of thee, O Mary; for He that is mighty hath done great things unto thee.

### *Postcommunion*

May the sacrament which we have received, O Lord, our God, heal in us the wounds of that sin from which, by a singular privilege, Thou didst preserve immaculate the conception of blessed Mary. Through our Lord...
