**From the Rector's Desk:**

*My Dear Faithful,*

During my spiritual retreat last week in St. Louis, I asked the Father Abbot, what were the 3 things he'd wish to say to Catholics in 2021. (I paraphrase in the following 3 points.)

- 1) Turn off or limit the news because even the "best" sites, even Catholic ones, contain many errors and are spiritually harmful with detraction. Many pridefully think themselves experts by reading a random article or two. They should consult the priest to help form their judgment.
- 2) During this crisis of Faith in members of the Church and worldwide gender-confusion in society, it's important that we pray for the Church and pray for our salvation.
- 3) It's important that we work on humility so that we are not critical and harsh in our judgments of neighbors.

We see so many people going into a rage about political issues, those angry of those forcing protocols and those not following protocols, and we often see the unholy fruits of the devil: anger, rage, denial of truth, hatred, pride and self-entitlement, jealousy and envy, chaos and anarchy. **Let us pray for the conversion of our world to the Sacred Heart of Christ, Who alone can give peace and rest to our souls and Who alone can bring salvation!**

As I've announced, to better serve our people of Tucson, I will be away at a Spanish immersion program for priests this summer. Your Sacramental needs will be taken care of by fellow Canons of the Institute and diocesan priests. I will be leaving after Sunday June 13th. In my absence, Abbe Molisse will be continuing Adult Catechism Classes on Saturdays at 9:15am using **This is the Faith** by Canon Ripley. I'm grateful that the seminary is allowing him to stay here throughout the summer until August helping around and providing some constancy while I'm away. I will be available by email for emergencies or questions.



**Alleluia** Ps 7:2 O Lord my God, in Thee I take refuge; save me from all my pursuers and rescue me. Alleluia.



## **Mass of the Sacred Heart of Jesus**

**INTROIT:** Ps. 32: 11,19,1 The thoughts of His Heart are from generation to generation: To deliver their souls from death, and feed them in famine. (Ps) Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just: praise becometh the upright. Glory be. The thoughts...

**COLLECT:** O God, Who in the Heart of Thy Son, wounded by our sins, dost mercifully bestow on us infinite treasures of love: grant, we beseech Thee, that whilst we render It the devout homage of our affection, we may also fulfill our duty of worthy satisfaction. Through the same our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** Eph. 3: 8-12, 14-19 Brethren: To me, the least of all the saints, is given this grace, to preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ: and to enlighten all men, that they may see what is the dispensation of the mystery which hath been hidden from eternity in God, Who created all things: that the manifold wisdom of God may be made known to the principalities and powers in heavenly places through the Church, according to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord: in Whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of Him. For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom all paternity in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened by His Spirit with might unto the inward man, that Christ may dwell by faith in your hearts: that, being rooted and grounded in charity, you may be able to comprehend with all the saints, what is the breadth and length, and height and depth: to know also the charity of Christ which surpasseth all knowledge, that you may be filled unto all the fullness of God.

**GRADUAL:** Ps. 24: 8-9 The Lord is sweet and righteous: therefore He will give a law to sinners in the way. He will guide the mild in judgment: He will teach the meek His ways.

**ALLELUIA:** Mt. 11:29 Alleluia, alleluia. Take my yolk upon you and learn of Me, because I am meek and humble of Heart: and you shall find rest to your souls. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** Jn. 19: 31-37 At that time: The Jews (because it was the Parasceve), that the bodies might not remain upon the cross on the Sabbath day (for that was a great Sabbath day) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. The soldiers therefore came: and they broke the legs of the first, and of the other that was crucified with Him. But after they were come to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water. And he that saw it hath given testimony: and his testimony is true. And he knoweth that he saith true, that you may believe. For these things were done that the Scripture might be fulfilled: You shall not break a bone of Him. And again another Scripture saith: They shall look on Him Whom they pierced.

**OFFERTORY:** Ps. 68: 21 My heart hath expected reproach and misery: and I looked for one that would grieve together with Me, but there was none: and for one that would comfort Me, and I found none.

**SECRET:** Have regard, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to the inexpressible love of the Heart of Thy beloved Son: so that what we offer may be a gift acceptable to Thee, and an expiation for our offenses. Through the same our Lord.

**PREFACE OF THE SACRED HEART:** It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God; Who didst will that Thine only-begotten Son, while hanging on the cross, should be pierced by a soldier's spear, that the Heart thus opened, a shrine of divine bounty, should pour out on us streams of mercy and grace, and that what never ceased to burn with love for us, should be a resting-place to the devout, and open as a refuge of salvation to the penitent. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing the hymn of Thy glory, evermore saying: Holy, Holy, Holy...

**COMMUNION:** Jn. 19: 34 One of the soldiers with a spear opened His side, and immediately there came out blood and water.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** May Thy holy mysteries, O Lord Jesus, impart to us divine fervor: wherein we may taste the sweetness of Thy most loving Heart, and learn to despise what is earthly and love what is heavenly: Who livest and reignest.

## ACT OF REPARATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



O sweet Jesus, Whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thy altar eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offenses, but also for the sins of those who, straying far from the path of salvation,

refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offenses against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behavior, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violation of Sundays and holy days, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against Thee and Thy Saints.

We wish also to make amends for the insults to which Thy Vicar on earth and Thy priests are subjected; for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy divine love; and lastly for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and the teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O Divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood! We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honor, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thine eternal Father on the cross and which Thou dost continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past.

Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee. O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may all one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.
